The group size of the classroom shall not exceed the maximum capacity specified in N.J.A.C. 6A:14-4.6.

He would like to add a goal for the Child Study Team to provide programming prioritizing mental health.

He suggested a goal revolving around the celebration of the school's growing diversity and diverse learners.

Lastly he would like a goal focusing on a new 5-year Strategic Plan and aligning the Strategic Plan towards the other goals. He would like this goal to reference a 5 year vision and plan of the direction the Board would like to see the district go.

Mr Wolford explained that a committee will need to be formed for the Strategic Plan which should be a collaboration of staff, BOE members, and community members.
