Scholarship History:

This scholarship was inspired by the 35th reunion of the Davenport Central High School Class of 1979 and by the CHS classes of '59' and '64' who had endowed scholarships. It was created in 2018 with the goal of assisting a current Central High graduate who has a financial need for college fees. It is also in appreciation of the Class of '79's own education and the teachers who helped advance their education and careers. Funding for this scholarship is anticipated to be \$1,000 each year, subject to investment returns.

Eligibility: Applicants must graduate from Davenport Central High School by the last day of June. Recipients must be enrolled for the 2021-22 term in an accredited two- or four-year college or university in the U.S. An Expected Family contribution (EFC) score determined by the FAFSA form must be provided with the application.

Requirements: Student must have a 3.25 GPA or 24 ACT. A letter of recommendation is required.

Application deadline is March 1, on or before 11:59 P.M.

Award: This endowed scholarship provides one (1) scholarship of up to \$1000 one-time award.

Selection Committee: Applications will be reviewed and the winner selected by members of the Davenport Schools Foundation Scholarship Committee.

If awarded this scholarship a verification of enrollment (Student Information Form) must be submitted to the Davenport Schools Foundation office by **June 1**. Failure to submit the Student Information Form may forfeit an award. Award funds will be distributed to the institution of enrollment in August.
