Games and Simulation

Are you a gamer? Are you part of the geek squad when it comes to technology? If the answer is "Yes," the Games and Simulation pathway is for you! This cutting-edge pathway prepares students with the foundational skills to enter the digital workforce with a focus on the procedures of project management, web and app development. Students in this pathway will receive hands-on training though mentorship and internship opportunities, opening the door to a career or post-secondary focus.

Students will have the opportunity to earn one or more of the following recognized industry certifications providing they meet the requirements: Amazon Web Services (AWS) Certified Developer, Microsoft Solutions Associate, Microsoft Solutions Developer, Microsoft Technology Associate, Unity Developer Certification



Drones (Operations)

The sky is the limit! Students in the Drones (Operations) pathway will learn the fundamentals of unmanned aircraft systems as they identify the core components of these devices and understand how they interact with one another. Using paper and foam models, students will learn the basics of coding, mapping, virtual and augmented reality and aerodynamics prior to designing, engineering, 3D printing and flying their own drones! A focus on battery and solar power will demonstrate how renewable energy can be used to lengthen flights.



Systems Diagnostics, Service and Repair

Do you have the need for speed? This pathway prepares students for an exciting future in the automotive service industry through the Ford Ace (Automotive Career Exploration) curriculum. With a focus on renewable energy concepts including Hybrids, Fuel Cell and Electric features, this is an excellent time to pursue a career in this demanding, high-skill industry. Through participation in mentorships and internships with our community partner, Sunrise Ford, students will build the skillset necessary to enter the workforce upon graduation as an entry-level technician, continue on to pursue additional certifications or a post-secondary degree in the auto field.



Financial Services

Let's get down to business! The Financial Services pathway empowers students to develop a new way of thinking, a new way of learning and a new model for action. With a focus on learning the principles of entrepreneurship and innovation, students will have the opportunity to take part in Wall Street by participating in online stock market games. By the time students successfully complete this pathway, they will be armed with the skills necessary to become a game changer in any business field – from higher education to innovation, entrepreneurship and beyond.



Design, Visual and Media Arts
