Permanent Classrooms for Student Learning

FUSD is in the process of completing a campus expansion at Sierra Lakes Elementary School, which will add a twostory classroom building to replace aging portables. A similar project to modernize student learning facilities is underway at Fontana Middle School where a two-story classroom building is being replaced to meet modern learning standards.

New Middle School at Citrus & Casa Grande

In recent years our community has continued to grow, with new housing under development and new families moving in. To prevent overcrowding and ensure all students have access to small classes and high-quality academic instruction, FUSD is in the process of constructing a new middle school, which will meet the growing needs of our District and provide Fontana students with personalized learning in modern classroom facilities.



In addition to bond funding, FUSD has been highly successful in leveraging developer fees, grants and federal funding to complete additional necessary improvements across the District.

Student Health Is a Top Priority

The District is currently in the process of replacing aging and deteriorating HVAC systems District wide. This project funded with COVID relief funds, will improve building air circulation and air quality. Systems in all schools are expected to be updated by November 2024.



Updated Athletic Facilities

FUSD is proud to challenge our students academically and physically. Recent athletic facility improvements will ensure the continued success of our students both on and off the field. Synthetic tracks and turf fields have recently been added or are under construction at Summit High School, Kaiser High School and Fontana High School.



By successfully leveraging developer fees, FUSD will be keep class sizes small on the growing north end of our community through the construction of a new elementary school (TK-5). This school is slated to open in time for the 2025-26 school year.
