LICENSED VOCATIONAL NURSE

Definition:

Under the direction of a school nurse performs specialized health care procedures for students. Performs related duties as required.

Examples of Duties:

- 1. Performs feeding, toileting, catheterization, gavage feeding, tracheotomy care, suctioning, as well as initiation of emergency procedures including, but not limited to seizure disorders, allergic reactions.
- 2. Monitors blood glucose for diabetic students.
- Administers short term medications to students.
- 4. Assists with the maintenance of daily logs and medical records.
- 5. Contacts parents and registered nurses and doctors.
- 6. Instructs individual students in health care.
- 7. Assists with immunization clinic, maintaining records and administering immunizations under direction of Registered Nurse.

Minimum Qualifications:

Knowledge of:

Community emergency medical resources; skill in the use of equipment and performance of techniques necessary to provide specialized physical health care services for individuals with exceptional needs.

Ability to:

Demonstrate competence in cardiopulmonary resuscitation; perform simple medical record keeping; perform routine arithmetical calculations with accuracy; understand and carry out oral and written directions; work cooperatively with those contacted during the course of work; drive to school sites.

Experience:

At least one (1) year of pediatric/ nursery hospital experience and/or recent experience in care of children with severe physical disabilities.

Education:

Completion of the approved course of study and all qualifying examinations necessary for certification as Licensed Vocational Nurse.

Special Licenses:

A valid California Vocational Nurse's License;

A valid Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) Certificate;

A valid California Driver's License.
