

Graduation Requirements

What happens when you fail a class??

- ONLY A's, B's, C's, & D's are considered passing grades that earn you credits
- Unlike middle school, you MUST retake classes that you fail in high school

Don't be fooled!



- You can have 230 credits and STILL NOT GRADUATE because you didn't pass the right classes to get those credits
- Check with your high school counselor REGULARLY to make sure you're on track!!!

Possible solutions:

- Retake class during summer school
- Retake class the next year
 - This solution may give you 7 or 8 classes instead of 6. That's a REALLY long day.
- If you fail too many classes, you may be sent to one of the alternative high schools.

** Your high school counselor will be KEY to letting you know which solution is best for you.

Sample High School Schedules

Typical Freshman (9th Grade) Schedule

- 1. English 9
- 2. Integrated Math 1
- 3. Biology
- 4. P.E.
- 5. College & Career Readiness
- 6. Elective

Typical Junior (11th Grade) Schedule

- 1. English 11
- 2. Integrated Math 3
- 3. Science (your choice)
- 4. U.S. History
- 5. Elective
- 6. Elective

- Each High School offers slightly different programs, so courses may vary.
- Taking honors courses may also alter your course of study.
- Failing classes will DEFINITELY alter your schedule!

Typical Sophomore (10th Grade) Schedule

- 1. English 10
- 2. Integrated Math 2
- 3. Chemistry
- 4. P.E.
- 5. World History
- 6. Elective

Typical Senior (12th Grade) Schedule

- 1. English 12
- 2. Government/Economics
- 3. Elective
- 4. Elective
- 5. Elective
- 6. Elective


^{**(}Seniors can also take only 5 classes IF they are ON TRACK ©)

Grade Point Average (G.P.A.)

What is it?

- A GPA is way of measuring academic achievement
- Each grade you earn, earns you points
 - A's are worth 4 points
 - B's are worth 3 points
 - C's are worth 2 points
 - D's are worth 1 point
 - F's earn 0 points
- Points can be averaged at the end of each semester, at the end of the whole year, and even at the end of your whole high school career for a CUMULATIVE GPA.

How do I calculate it?



High School as a Bridge to College &/or Career

College Entrance

- Getting into the college of your choice takes some planning.
- Each college has different criteria they look for:
 - Taking and passing all the correct classes in high school with a "C" or better.
 (This is what colleges call "A-G compliant") Go back to the slide with the graduation requirements to see which are A, B, C, D, E, F, & G classes.
 - Some colleges & universities still require an SAT score or an ACT score. How high the score needs to be will vary by college.
 - Colleges & universities will also look at your OVERALL G.P.A. "Overall" or "cumulative" means the average of ALL the classes you take in high school. That's why every year is IMPORTANT!!
 - Many schools also want to know about the clubs you were in, sports you
 played, community service hours you dedicated... basically they want MORE
 than just good grades and high test scores.
