HAYWOOD EXPLODES IN FINAL HALF, DOWNS CROCKETT GRIDDERS 50-29

There are two things fairly certain about Haywood County's football team: (1) they're going to score; and (2) they're probably going to taunt you after they do.

When you can hang 50 points on the scoreboard, you can afford the more than 100 yards in penalties the Tomcats received Friday night in using a strong second half to defeat Crockett County 50-29 in a Region 7-4A game. It doesn't make it any easier to witness.

Haywood's win sets up a regular season windup game with Dyer County for the top seed in the region. Both of them are 3-0 and will face off Halloween night in Newbern. Crockett will be the region's #3 seed whether it wins or loses in its season finale with Fayette-Ware that same evening. The Cavs will be 2-2 in the region with a victory, but even a 1-3 mark gives them the seed because of the current tiebreaking advantages.

While Haywood appears to be the top team in the region, Crockett was right with them Friday night at the end of the first half, deadlocked at 22-all. But the game turned just two minutes into the third quarter when Cav quarterback Ben Burgess was hit on a hurried pass attempt and the Tomcats' Jeffery Parker picked it off near the line of scrimmage and lumbered 54 yards for the go-ahead touchdown.

Haywood quickly forced a punt on the next Crockett possession and promptly drove 77 yards for another score, with Earvin Jones posting the touchdown on a 24-yard run.

The Cavalier offense, which had consistently moved the ball during the exciting first half, was stymied in the third period and most of the fourth. If wide receiver Kris Phillips had not turned his first pass reception of the season into a 61-yard gain for the hosts, Crockett would have been under 50 total yards for the second half.

Meanwhile, Haywood racked up 248 yards through the air in the ballgame, completing 14 of 18 throws with its two-quarterback system and bevy of skilled receivers. Caden Harris caught six tosses for 101 yards to lead the attack, but Jaden Butler snared two touchdown passes to push the final margin toward the lopsided position.

Still, Crockett Coach Kevin Ward was optimistic after the contest.

"I know the players are disappointed," he said, "but I'm not disappointed with the effort we showed and the passion we played with. We had our opportunities. They beat us on special teams, and you won't win many games if you get beat there. But I'd like to play this team again in the playoffs. And we'll have our chance if we play together and play as hard as we did tonight."

Haywood's Cam Miller ran the opening kickoff back 75 yards to the Crockett 19, and it looked like it was about to be a long evening for the Cavaliers. But on the Tomcats' first pass attempt of the night, Crockett's Dre Walker stepped in front of the intended receiver and returned it 37 yards to the Haywood 48.

Power runs by DK Woods and a 10-yard pass to Walker moved the ball to the 16. Crockett then lined Woods up in a solo Wildcat formation, but when he took the direct snap from center, he handed it off to a streaking Amarion Hobson on a counter move and the speedy junior took it all the way to the end zone. Avery Hurst's extra point gave the Cavs a 7-0 edge, serving notice that Haywood was in for a fight.

Challenge accepted, said the Tomcats. Four plays later, Kemonte Williams broke a 45-yard scoring run, and the extra point by Japheth Sanchez made it 7-7 with 6:35 left in the first.

The Tomcats forced a Hurst punt on the next series, and Harris – a tremendous wide receiver with college offers galore – fielded it at his own 10, gave a couple of jukes, and sailed down the right sideline for 90 yards and a touchdown. Sanchez made it 14-7 at the 3:09 mark.

Crockett answered right back with a 50-yard march after Haywood hit the receiver who signaled for a fair catch on the pooched kickoff. Woods carried five times on the drive, and dragged a couple of tacklers into the end zone from two yards out for the tying touchdown early in the second period.

Haywood responded with another quick score. Quarterback Cayden Sanders connected with Harris on a 49-yard bomb down the left sideline to set up a 16-yard touchdown burst by Miller. To make things more interesting, the Tomcats went for two points on the conversion and Williams ran in easily, giving the visitors a 22-14 lead with 7:13 to play in the half.

The Cavs answered again after Squirt Pickens zipped 44 yards with the Haywood kickoff, all the way to the visitors' 31. Crockett advanced to the four, but on a fourth-and-goal from there, Walker took a pass from Burgess and was tackled at the one, giving the Tomcats possession again.

On the next play - running a shotgun formation from his own end zone - Haywood's Sanders dropped the snap and appeared to be hopelessly cornered for a safety, but the Cavs couldn't get him down before he released a short throw that fell incomplete near an eligible receiver. Sanders then hit Harris for 15 yards to establish some breathing room, although Crockett finally forced a Sanchez punt.

Woods - who ended the game with 118 yards on 21 carries, 17 of them in the opening half - quickly burst for a 38-yard gain to the Tomcat 27. Three plays later, Burgess found Hobson in the right corner of the end zone from 22 yards out with just 43 seconds remaining before intermission. Ward called for a two-point conversion try, which Woods successfully produced from the Wildcat formation.

Crockett's Nolen Turner recovered a Carson Graves fumble on the half's final play, and the hosts appeared ready to give Haywood a powerful scare over the final 24 minutes – until they actually began. Haywood added three touchdowns by the time only 11:35 remained in the game, but Phillips' 61-yard scamper with a short pass set up an eight-yard scoring pass to Walker, pulling the Cavs within a 43-29 margin with 8:39 to go.

Hurst then executed a hard onside kick that ricocheted off a Tomcat and was recovered by Crockett's Brody Parlow at the Haywood 42, and the Cavs were open for business – until fumbling it right back to the Tomcats on the very next play. When they turned the gift into the second Butler touchdown reception, the game was effectively over.

Crockett is now 6-3 and closes the regular season Halloween night by hosting Fayette-Ware, which is winless in region play. The Cavs yielded 421 yards in total offense to the Tomcats, who also had the long punt and interception returns for scores. Additionally notable was that Deuce Greenhill - Crockett's top offensive threat entering the game with 803 yards gained from scrimmage - never touched the ball for the Cavs.

Crockett's Halloween game will be preceded by a Trick-or-Treating time - from 4:30-6:30 - on the high school campus between the tennis courts and the softball and baseball fields. Several school organizations, athletic teams, and other vendors will be providing candy to children, as well as other items for sale. All children in costume will also be allowed into the football game free of charge.




