Dear Parents and Guardians,

The purpose of this letter is to notify you of the Nevada School Performance Framework (NSPF) classification of your child’s school, what this classification means, what the district and school are doing to provide support and address the needs of the school, and where you can find additional accountability information. As a parent and your child’s first teacher we invite you to be an active partner in helping the school make positive academic gains.

The No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB) requires that all groups of students be proficient in Math and Reading. The NSPF classifies schools within a five-star performance rating system with 1-star being the lowest rating and 5-stars the highest. The NSPF includes multiple measures of student achievement and growth and aligns the designations for schools to the delivery of appropriate supports and rewards. The NSPF index score is a score out of one hundred for a school. Index scores are comprised of the total points earned across several indices. For elementary and middle schools star ratings in the NSPF are based on student growth, proficiency, subgroup performance gaps, and chronic absenteeism. For high schools NSPF star ratings are based on proficiency, subpopulation performance gaps, growth, graduation, college and career readiness, chronic absenteeism and 9th grade credit deficiency.

For the 2024-2025 school year, C. C. Meneley Elementary School achieved an index score of 32.5 and a star rating of 2. The following table provides the star-ratings assigned to the Douglas County School District schools.

- A 2-star school - Identifies a school that has **partially met** the state’s standard for performance. Students and subgroups often meet expectations for academic performance or growth but may have multiple areas that require improvement. Areas requiring significant improvement are uncommon. The school must submit an improvement plan that identifies supports tailored to subgroups and indicators that are below standard. A 2-star school in consecutive years is subject to state intervention. Schools identified for targeted support and improvement or comprehensive support and improvement are eligible to be classified as two-star schools.
- A 3-star school – Identifies an **adequate** school that has met the state’s standard for performance. The all-students group has met expectations for academic achievement or growth. Subgroups meet expectations for academic achievement or growth with little exception; however, no group is far below standard. The school must submit an improvement plan that identifies supports tailored to subgroups and indicators that are below standard. Schools identified for comprehensive support and improvement are not eligible to be

classified as a three-star school or higher. Schools identified for targeted support and improvement are eligible to be classified as three-star schools.

- A 4-star school - Recognizes a **commendable** school that has performed well for all students and subgroups. A four-star school demonstrates satisfactory to strong academic performance for all students. Further, the school is successfully promoting academic progress for all student groups as reflected in closing opportunity gaps. The school does not fail to meet expectations for any group on any indicator. Schools identified for targeted support and improvement are not eligible to be classified as four-star school or higher.
- A 5-star school - Recognizes a **superior** school that exceeds expectations for all students and subgroups on every indicator category with little or no exception. A five-star school demonstrates superior academic performance and growth with no opportunity gaps. The school does not fail to meet expectations for any group on any indicator. These schools are recognized for distinguished performance.
