

57 student-athletes maintained a **3.5** or higher





STUDENT DISTINCTIONS

Top Cat - Each member of the STM faculty and staff selects one outstanding student from his or her entire class enrollment. These students are chosen because they display a positive attitude, are considerate to their fellow classmates, are cooperative and helpful, and demonstrate other traits of a model student. **60 seniors received the Top Cat Award**

Breakfast of Champions - Each faculty member nominates one student based on attitude, motivation, service, discipline, and being "God's Servant first." 70 seniors were honored as a Champion.

Cougar Court - Cougar Court was established to salute male and female students who have demonstrated exceptional leadership on campus and represent the ideals of St. Thomas More in the community. These students set an example for other students and invest their own time to make a significant impact on their school community. They consistently make good choices and exhibit positive attitudes. Cougar Court is celebrated during basketball Homecoming. 12 seniors were selected to Cougar Court.

Cougars of the Month - male and female seniors are nominated by faculty who exemplify the true spirit of "God's Servant First". Nominees are voted on by their peers. 11 boys and 10 girls were selected and 2 seniors were named Cougars of the Year.

COLLEGE ACCEPTANCE PROFILE

Since the inception of St. Thomas More Catholic High School in 1982, STM graduates have earned admission into a widely diverse profile of post secondary education. On average, 60 percent of graduates receive scholarship awards. A forerunner in student accomplishments, on average, 98 percent of St. Thomas More Catholic High School graduates pursue higher education at the college level.
