


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
#### Julie Cunard

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

#### **Homecoming Week 2024**

During Homecoming Week, our Elementary students, teachers and staff enjoyed dressing up for color day. We are so blessed as a school community to share in such special memories together.











#### **High School Chemistry Lab**

Possibly the most common question a chemistry teacher gets from students on Back to School Night and during the first week of school is, 'Do we get to blow stuff up/burn things?" My answer is always- "Yes!" Some of my own best memories of chemistry in high school and college are of the laboratory experiences I shared with my lab partners, and it is important that my students get to do the same. Bunsen burners, flames, chemical reactions and dangerous chemicals are the things that draw many students in to chemistry and get them excited. Of course, this is not an everyday thing, and it needs to be relevant to the content standards and also done in a safe way!

In class, we have been investigating atomic structure and the movement of electrons within atoms. When electrons absorb energy, they can 'jump' to a higher energy level within the atom. In order to return to their normal 'home' level, electrons need to release this energy. We see this as light, with each element producing characteristic colors of light and also their own emission spectra (kind of like an elemental fingerprint) due their electron configuration.

In order to prepare for the lab itself, we spent the day before the lab reviewing safety and practicing how to use a Bunsen burner. For many students, this was the first time they had ever lit a match before! Students learned how to light a match, use it to ignite the Bunsen burner, adjust the flames, and then safely turn it off. Safety is always important- and even more so when flame tests occur.

On the following day, students used the Bunsen burners to burn samples of different elements- strontium, potassium, copper, lithium, sodium, calcium and zinc. They made observations on the colors of light produced, and used this information to draw conclusions about the relative amounts of energy released by each element. Mr. Ruta was even able to join in the fun during 6th period chemistry!

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# ATHLETIC CORNER

#### **Athletic Training Tidbits with Dr. Kemper**

**Fall to Winter Sport Hydration Transition** A friendly reminder that while many fall athletes are conditioned as they venture out to winter sports, the key factor here is their hydration. Many athletes suffer from cramping, which is a heat-related illness. as they transition from an indoor sport in the fall to an outdoor sport in the winter? You may be thinking why... and the reason is because of the various factors that account for human hydration. Although the winter sports are taking place during a cooler outdoor season then fall sports, it still carries more humidity than inside in the gymnasium. So the athletes that are used to the indoor conditions still need to go through a general heat acclimatization process and increase both water and electrolyte consumption to prevent heat-related illnesses, which most commonly starts as muscle cramps.

#### TIPS-

- 1. Increase water intake throughout the day. A general rule is to drink about half of your body weight in ounces per day. Example: You weigh 100 pounds, you should always aim to drink a minimum of 50 ounces of water daily. Increase that if you are participating in athletics by at least 16 ounces
- 2. Include electrolytes in your everyday diet. Bananas, citrus fruits, adding salt to meals and chicken, pickles. You can also use sports drinks such as Gatorade, Powerade, etc.
- 3. Keep in mind, the body needs a balance of both water and electrolytes to prevent cramping.
- 4. STRETCH! Keep those muscles warm, stretch before activity, and even stretch before bed.

She also teaches the Introduction to Sports Medicine class at BCS to allow students a deeper look into the athletic training and other sports medicine fields.
