2025-2026 ENROLLMENT

It's nearly that time of year again! Classical School's new student application period for the 2025-2026 school year will begin December 2, 2024. Applications will be accepted for the lottery through February 21, 2025. Any applications received after that date will be added to the waiting list (or enrollment list if we still have openings) in the order in which they are received.

Students who are currently attending Classical School do NOT need to reapply; however, siblings who are not currently enrolled at Classical School must submit a completed application during the lottery application acceptance window to be included in and receive sibling priority in the lottery drawing. Incoming kindergarteners for the 2025-2026 school year also need to apply between December 2, 2024 and **February 21, 2025** to be included in the lottery drawing.

Paper applications will be available beginning December 2nd in the school office. Alternatively, there will be an online application that may be accessed from the school's website, http://classical.aasd.k12.wi.us beginning on December 2, 2024. JOB OPPORTUNITY

The Appleton Area School District is allowing individuals with a two- or four-year degree to apply to become permit substitute teachers. Your degree does not need to be in education.

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What is a permit substitute? Individuals with a two- or four-year degree may apply to become three-year short-term substitute

permit teachers. Your degree does not need to be in education but does need to be from an accredited two- or four-year degree granting institution. The three-year short-term substitute permit allows the holder to accept short-term substitute assignments in any subject at any grade level (no more than 45 days total in a specific assignment.)

Compensation: Daily Rate: \$70.00/half day and \$140.00/full day Long-Term Rate (11-19 consecutive days): \$80.00/half day and \$160.00/full day Long-Term Rate (20 or more consecutive days): \$105.00/half day and \$210.00/full day

Eligibility: BS or Associate Degree from an accredited college or university, work well with student population in an education setting, understand and use a variety of technology, problem solving, and learning approaches, use effective verbal and non-verbal communication techniques and foster relationships with students, parents/guardians, colleagues, and the community.

Step 1: If you do not have a teaching license, go to the CESA 6 website: https://www.cesa6.org/services/substitute-teachers/overview.cfm and sign up for the teacher training. Once the training is completed you can apply for your Substitute Teaching License through the Department of Public Instruction.

Step 2: Submit interest through Frontline Applitrack: https://www.applitrack.com/aasd/onlineapp

Once you have completed the application in Frontline, a District representative will call you for a phone interview. Phone references will then be done. If recommended, you will receive a new-hire packet, which includes a drug/TB test and background check. There are four online classes that will need to be taken, and you will go through a short substitute orientation.

Student Council sponsors Wear it Wednesdays throughout the school year. November 20th is Wear Your Favorite Jersey Day.




KINDERGARTEN RECITAL


