

History

The Summit's story began in 1890, when The Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur opened the Our Lady of Cincinnati School for girls. In 1927, Our Lady of Cincinnati became The Summit Country Day School, and the curriculum expanded to include physical education and a variety of cultural programs. In 1941, The Summit Boys School was established for students in grades one through eight. In 1963, two Sisters of Notre Dame introduced a Montessori program for three-to-five-yearold students. The Summit Primary School opened in 1970 for students in grades one through three, and separate middle schools for boys and girls were established for students in grades four through eight. Boys began attending the Summit Upper School for the first time in 1972, and the school's first coeducational class graduated in 1976. In 1980, a board of trustees independent from the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur assumed governance and operational responsibilities of the school. The Summit continues today as an independent Catholic school while maintaining its close affiliation with the Sisters.

Programs

The 356 students in the Upper School experience opportunities to excel and lead through rigorous academics, competitive athletics, and wide-ranging extracurriculars. In addition to a robust college preparatory curriculum that includes 24 Advanced Placement classes and two ground-breaking Centers for Excellence – the Schiff Family Science Research Institute and the Homan Center for Entrepreneurial Leadership – the Upper School is known for its signature Leaders of Character and advisory programs as well as initiatives in creative problem solving.

The Opportunity

As a key member of The Summit's Senior Leadership Team and the Educational Team, the Upper School Director will step into a role that is rich in opportunity for creating a vibrant Upper School learning community with clear and compelling expectations for students, faculty, and staff.

Per The Summit's most recently approved Strategic Plan, the Upper School Director will work collaboratively with faculty and staff to thoughtfully transition the traditional Upper School program into one that is more highly interactive, project-based, and focused on student centered action learning without diminishing the academic rigor and success of the existing program.

Some of the Director's most significant opportunities include:

- Inspiring and supporting curricular growth and technological innovation to more fully prepare students to impact our world beyond the classroom
- Refining the administrative structure within the Upper School to best serve both the division and The Summit as an all-school community
- Expanding community, corporate, and university engagement and partnerships to support and further develop Centers of Excellence within the school
- Ensuring that The Summit is the school of choice for educational professionals because of its focus on leadership, wellness, and professional development
- Re-affirming the school's open, welcoming, and respectful invitation to all members of the school community, regardless of faith tradition and culture, to full participation and partnership in the school's mission, commitment to the Five Pillars, and service

- Knowledgeable and experienced with transitioning a traditional upper school/high school curriculum and pedagogy toward student-centered, project-based learning
- A Catholic in good standing



Qualities Sought:

- A genuine and visible warmth of personality; demonstrates a high level of emotional intelligence
- An expressive and articulate communication style that reflects transparency and accountability, with listening as a foundational value
- A distributive style of leadership that supports, empowers, appreciates, and develops the leadership potential of all colleagues within the school community
- An open-mindedness and collaborative spirit that informs and invites stakeholders throughout the school in engaging in the process of innovation
- A growth mindset appreciating the assets already in place while identifying what additional resources and progress will be necessary for growth
- Comfortable reflecting a strong sense of personal faith and integrity, and serving as a role model for others -- including students and adults -- in the school community
