#### November 2024 Attendance Updates

When calling in your child for an attendance please **state the reason for the absence**. Our school contact number is as follows: 920.852.5505, then follow the prompts. When using Infinite Campus to report an absence, please state the reason for the absence online.

Robo calls go out to families at 9:00 AM each morning if your child is absent from school and we have not heard from you. Please contact the school and report the absence so it is not recorded as an unexcused absence.

#### November-Diabetes Awareness Month

Diabetes is a chronic condition that occurs when the body can't produce enough insulin or can't use insulin properly, resulting in high blood sugar levels.

Where does insulin come from and what role does it play? Insulin is a hormone produced by the pancreas. It helps move sugar from the bloodstream into the body's cells to be used for energy. Think of this whole process like a lock and key system. Imagine that the body's cells have locked doors and insulin is the key that opens the locks to allow the sugar in. The pancreas is the company that makes the keys.

What happens to insulin in diabetes? There are three types of diabetes: Type 1, Type 2 and gestational diabetes. Type 1 diabetes is an autoimmune condition where the body mistakenly attacks the cells in the pancreas that create insulin. Eventually the pancreas can't make insulin anymore or can't make enough to keep up with the body's needs. The company has stopped manufacturing keys so there are little to no keys available to open the locks. In Type 2 diabetes, the body produces insulin but cannot use it properly. The company is still making keys but the locks are rusty so the keys don't open the locks as well. Gestational diabetes is a type of diabetes that occurs when a pregnant person is unable to produce enough insulin or use the insulin effectively. There are not enough keys and some of the locks are rusty.


What are the common symptoms of diabetes? Per the American Diabetes Association, some common symptoms of diabetes include:

- Urinating often
- Feeling very thirsty
- Feeling very hungry even though you are eating
- Extreme fatigue
- Blurry vision
- Cuts/bruises that are slow to heal
- Weight loss even though you are eating more (type 1)
- Tingling, pain, or numbness in your hands/feet (type 2)

Can diabetes be prevented? There is currently no known way to prevent Type 1 diabetes. Things that can help to lower chances of developing Type 2 diabetes include eating healthy, being active, and maintaining a healthy weight. The American Diabetes Association offers a free 60-second Type 2 Diabetes Risk Test.

Dear Parents and Guardians,

We are writing this letter to inform you of our upcoming standardized English test, ACCESS for English Learner's (ELs). As mandated by Wisconsin law, one of our primary responsibilities is to assess the English language skills of eligible students and provide information to you. Our overall goal is to provide language and academic support so that ELs reach their full potential and participate fully in their educational experience. Students are only eligible to exit the EL program with a current ACCESS level. If your child does not take the ACCESS test during the testing window, he/she will not be able to exit EL programming this academic year.

In the next two to three months, the ACCESS test will be administered to all ELs in the Appleton Area School District. The results will provide information about the language and literacy needs of your child. After the tests have been corrected and scored, we will share the results with you.

In some cases, your child already participates in the district's EL / Bilingual Program. For others, there is no direct language service or services have been refused, but we are required by law to administer the assessment to all EL students. Please understand that discussion of any direct service will involve you, and no student will be placed in EL classes without your permission.

Johnston Elementary School will be administering the ACCESS test December 3 - 17, 2024. If you have any questions about the ACCESS test, please contact the EL teachers listed below at your child's school.
