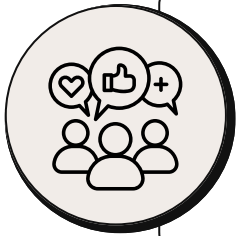

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Graduation Requirement

A Washington State graduation requirement since 2009, the High School and Beyond Plan (HSBP) is developed around three guiding questions: Who am I?, What can I become?, and How do I become that?



What Is It?

The HSBP is a process. Each year students engage in activities related to career research like inventories, goal setting, and creating a personalized plan. Students work with their counselor & homeroom teacher to revise their plan each year, adjusting for changing interests, goals, and plans.



Participating Grades

Students begin their HSBP in 7th grade and revise it every year through graduation. The HSBP informs what classes students take throughout high school, ensuring students graduate with the classes they need to support their next steps. HSBP lessons are given during Homeroom.



Credit for HSBP

In high school, students can earn credit for completing their HSBP tasks! Students can earn .5 elective credits per year. Over 4 years freshman can earn up to 2 semester credits, freeing up space for other classes in later years. You must complete all HSBP tasks during the year to earn credit.



SchoolLinks
