

Middle School Athletic Coach is responsible for planning, leading, supervising and teaching middle school student athletes. Individuals must have knowledge of his/her sport and model good sportsmanship at all times.

Chain of Command

The Middle School Athletic Coach works under the direction of the site and district athletic directors and reports to the building principal.

Competencies of the Middle School Athletic Coach

- **Accountability:** Holds self and others accountable for measurable high-quality, timely results. Determines objectives, and sets priorities. Accepts responsibility for mistakes.
- **Communication:** Effectively communicate to audiences in diverse situations through strong written and verbal communication skills.
- **Collaboration:** Works productively and positively with others within and across departments and schools.
- **Problem Solving:** Identifies and analyzes problems; weighs relevance and accuracy of information; generates and evaluates alternative solutions; makes recommendations.
- **Resilience:** Deals effectively with pressure; remains optimistic and persistent, even under adversity. Recovers quickly from setbacks

Essential Duties of the Middle School Athletic Coach

- Implement and follow all rules and regulations from the Kyrene Athletic Program (KAP) Guidelines, Kyrene Family Handbook and Coaches requirements.
- Provide a coach's letter to parents at start of each athletic season.
- Required attendance at all athletic meetings, including KAP Season and school coaches' meetings.
- Facilitate a parent meeting at the beginning of the sport season.
- Assist the site Athletic Director with the distribution and prompt return of all uniforms and equipment.
- Responsible for adherence to practice and game times.
- Provide constant supervision of all students at all times.
- Communicate in a timely manner with parents, students, site athletic director and office staff concerning practice times.
- Must complete Kyrene district Hazing Policy and COVID-19 acknowledgement forms.
- Performs other duties of a similar nature and level, as assigned.

Minimum Qualifications

High School Diploma or GED is required; or, an equivalent combination of education and experience sufficient to successfully perform the essential duties of the job such as those listed above.

Licensing/Certification Requirements

- Must hold Valid Arizona fingerprint clearance card.
- Must have current CPR, First Aid, Concussion Training Certification, COVID-19 for Coaches Certification
- Cheer coaches must hold AIA certification

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
