SouthCoast Community Foundation: Over 100 scholarships totaling over \$700,000 are available for students on the South Coast and South Shore! Applications are being accepted November 1st through January 21st. <u>List of scholarships available</u>.

- Personal essays on (1) leadership or community engagement and (2) a challenging first-hand experience;
- Most recent transcript;
- Statement of support (can be from a teacher, coach, faith leader, family member, family friend, etc.)
- Note: No FAFSA required!

AFL-CIO Scholarship Awards Program

The 67th Annual Massachusetts AFL-CIO Scholarship Awards Program is now open. Through the program, the Massachusetts AFL-CIO and affiliated unions are proud to award financial resources to high school students pursuing trade union programs or college/university study. The Massachusetts AFL-CIO administers half a million dollars of scholarship awards on behalf of unions and labor councils throughout the state. Individual awards range from \$500 to \$16,000. You can view a list of available awards and their criteria here.

All graduating seniors in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts who are seeking a college degree or job training are eligible to compete. Scholarship awards this year total over half a million dollars. To qualify, students must be a senior in high school, fill out the online application and then take the AFL-CIO exam. Applicants must register in advance at www.massaflcio.org/scholarships.

Applications will be accepted through Friday, December 20, 2024. The deadline is firm, and no late registrations will be accepted. The exam consists of 30 multiple choice questions and one written essay. All questions will be selected from the information in the study guide. Exams will be administered online, and will be offered to registered students between Monday, February 3, 2025, and Friday February 7, 2025. Classmarker will be used to administer the exams online. Paper tests will be available upon request. All study resources including the study guide, flashcards and quizzes are available by visiting www.learnlaborhistory.com. 
