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## Annual Notification to Parents and Eligible Students Confidentiality and Student Records

August 2024

Dear Bismarck Public School Parents and Eligible Students,

Today, I want to be sure you know your rights under two federal laws – the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment (PPRA). Parents of students, and eligible students (at least 18 years of age) who wish to review any or all of the education records pertaining to the student should submit a written request to the building principal. The records will be reviewed with school personnel, and parents/eligible students may obtain copies of such records.

If parents/eligible students believe all or part of the records are inaccurate, misleading, or otherwise in violation of the student's privacy rights, he/she may make a written request to the student's principal to have such records amended. If the principal and parent/eligible student cannot agree about the proposed amendment, the parent/eligible student has the right to request a hearing. In most cases, school districts cannot disclose personally identifiable information from students' education records without the consent of parents/eligible students. However, some of the exceptions are:

- 1. Personally identifiable information from students' education records can be disclosed to school officials with a legitimate educational interest. A school official is defined as an individual who has a legitimate educational interest in accessing student educational records and is affiliated with the District in one of the following capacities: An individual employed by the District in an administrative, instructional, or support staff position; school board members; contractors, consultants, volunteers, service providers, or other party with whom the school or District has outsourced institutional services or functions for which the school or District would otherwise use employees; records provided to these third parties must remain directly under the District's control for purposes of maintenance and use and the third party must agree to comply with 34 C.F.R. 99.33(a). Examples include, but are not limited to, school resource officers, interns, student teachers, the district's attorney(s), PowerSchool, SLDS, learning management software, hot lunch tracking software, Viewpoint, and District alert systems.
- 2. Upon request, a school may disclose education records, without consent, to officials of other school districts, in which a student seeks or intends to enroll, or has already enrolled if the disclosures are for purposes of the student's enrollment or transfer. (Upon request, parents/ eligible students may have copies of the records disclosed). To review additional disclosures allowed under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, please see 34 CFR Part 99 or contact your child's principal.

- 3. Federal law permits a school district to identify certain information as "<u>Directory Information</u>" which may be *publicly* released unless parents/eligible students inform the District otherwise (<u>see "A" on page 3</u>). Bismarck Public Schools identifies this information as the following: name (first and last), address, telephone listing, date and place of birth, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, grade level, photograph, school email address, student identification number (if it cannot be used alone to access an educational record and is not the student's social security number), weight and height of members of athletic teams, dates of attendance, degrees, honors, and awards received, and most recent school attended.
- 4. Federal law requires school districts to provide 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>, and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students' names, addresses and phone numbers to <u>military recruiters</u> upon request unless parents/eligible students inform the District otherwise (see "B" on page 3).
- 5. State law requires school districts to provide 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, and 11<sup>th</sup> grade students' names, addresses, and phone numbers to the <u>North Dakota University System</u>, which in turn discloses to the state's colleges and universities <u>(see "C" on page 3)</u> unless parents/eligible students inform the District otherwise.
- 6. Every two years, the Bismarck School District participates in the national "Youth Risk Behavior Survey." Sponsored by the Centers for Disease Control, this survey helps public entities identify and respond to social issues affecting children. This survey is given randomly to students in grades 7 12, and covers subject matters such as personal safety, violence, drug/alcohol use, sexual behavior, and emotional and physical health. The survey is highly confidential there is no way to trace survey results back to a particular student. During this school year, the Youth Risk Behavior Survey will be conducted in March 2025. Unless parents/eligible students inform the District otherwise, students will be asked to participate in this survey (see "D" on page 3).

If you do NOT want your child's information disclosed (see #3 through #6 above), please complete the attached form, and return it to your child's school office by September 13, 2024. If we do not receive the attached form back by this date, we will assume there are no objections to disclosing the information listed above. Again, my best wishes to your family this school year.
