Dear, Wausau School District Community:

We are reaching out to let you know that our Elementary Facility Plan Citizen Task Force met for the seventh time on October 30, 2024. As another reminder, this is part of the Wausau School District/Board's process to create a long-range elementary school facilities plan. That plan will focus, in particular, on whether the number of elementary schools in the Wausau School District should be reduced and if so, then how, where, and when.

Facilitating the process is Mark Roffers from MDRoffers Consulting, LLC – a school facility planning and projections firm.

To ensure transparency throughout this entire process, we want you to know what's happening in those task force meetings. To help, we've created a webpage dedicated to the work of the task force. [Click here](#) to access it. At the bottom of the page, you'll find agendas, meeting summaries, and materials from each meeting. As you'll see, the meeting on October 30 had one main component:

- Presentation and Evaluation of four more elementary facility consolidation options (these are NOT proposals for attendance area adjustments or consolidations. Instead, these are intended to aid the task force in evaluating one of several potential options for how elementary schools and attendance areas could potentially be adjusted to satisfy the 5-option criteria).

**The Elementary Facility Plan Citizen Task Force is weighing options as they get closer to making a recommendation for the Wausau School Board. However, at this point, the Task Force is still not near their finalized recommendation.**

At the conclusion of their work in December, the task force will prepare and present a report summarizing their findings and advisory recommendations to the School Board. Any final decisions will come from the Wausau School Board as the task force is advisory only.
