By providing an excellent academic curriculum, a unique corporate work study experience and the support of our spiritual community, we prepare students for a life of faith, purpose and service.

Prior to the 2017-2018 school year, the school rebranded. Now, the school is known formally as Immaculate Conception Academy, but commonly called ICA Cristo Rey Academy.

- Attend classes four days a week and work in corporate offices one day a week.
- Gain four years of professional experience through the Corporate Work Study (CWS).
- Take six college prep courses per semester in addition to CWS.
- Never miss class time as the academic schedule is structured to accommodate CWS.
- Are equipped with the knowledge, character, and skill to become the leaders of tomorrow.

Additional Program Highlights

- <u>The All Stars Project Partnership</u> -- Students participate in workforce development through the All Star's performance-based programs and trainings.
- <u>Project Lead the Way Engineering Essentials course</u> Students explore the breadth of engineering careers as they develop essential skills such as problem-solving, critical and creative thinking, communication, collaboration, and perseverance.
- <u>Ethnic Studies Literature</u> Designed to meet California's Ethnic Studies requirement, every sophomore takes this literature course broadening students' perspectives by studying fiction and nonfiction pieces representing a variety of cultures and races, encouraging students to see their own culture from another culture's point of view, and fostering deep discussions that cultivate critical thinking and effective communication.

Grade Calculations

The calculation of a student's academic standing is based on weighted GPA and includes all courses (save PE and College Prep). All honors courses are UC approved and receive an extra point in GPA, except H Algebra II. Official grade reporting occurs twice per year. Class rank is based on weighted semester grades, but is not reported to students. Our lowest passing mark is a D-. GPA is calculated on a 4.0 scale, with .3 deducted for a minus and .3 added for a plus.
