Rolling Meadows Elementary School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math.

- Make sure your child arrives to school on time every day by 7:30 AM
- Read nightly with your child and provide opportunities for them to hear you read fluently
- Will practice rote counting and one to one correspondence counting
- Update teacher with changes in our contact information (phone number, email, pick-up etc.)
- Will attend parent workshops and academic nights to learn tips and strategies to use at home (or access resources online)
- Will read emails and newsletters sent home by the teacher and school

Students will ...

- Treat my classmates and adults kindly with my words and actions
- Listen to my parent/guardian read to me each night
- Practice counting with my parent/guardian each night
- Talk to my parent/ guardian about what I am learning at school
- Practice identifying upper and lower case letters, sounds, and letter formation
