

AAC+D Memorizing math facts is important. Whether it's addition, subtraction, multiplication or division, when students have these math facts memorized, it sets them up for success in more advanced math courses and math concepts down the road. Cognitive scientists agree that memorizing facts is important because it frees up brainpower or working memory so students can focus on more complex mathematical tasks like how to solve a multistep word problem, analyze and see connections in a data set, or understand the "language" of advanced math. It's harder for students to do those things when they're focusing their thoughts and brain power on basic math computations.

So, break out those flashcards, and play some fun games with math facts. Focus on improving the number of problems students get correct, or the speed with which they know the answers. Reward effort, make it fun, and be their cheerleader. If you need some fun math fact games to play, reach out. Classroom teachers and I have a bunch of fun game ideas! Nurse's Nook

- Hand washing is the single most important way we can reduce the spread of infectious diseases among children and adults. Remind children to wash their hands before eating or use hand wipes or sanitizer, after bathroom use and when sneezing/coughing into their hands.
- Please keep students home with fever 100.0 degrees or greater, vomiting or diarrhea. They must be fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medication before returning to school.
- If you child is placed on an antibiotic for Strep or pinkeye or other contagious illness they must be on the medication for 24 hours before returning to school.
 - Please remember to send a note to school or email attendance that your child was out sick and with what illness. The school nurse does track for illness each month.
- Students may bring cough drops to school with a note from the parent, please only send enough to get them through the day 3-4 drops.
 - High Pollen days can be tough on kids, please remind them to wash their hands and even faces when they come back inside from recess, if needed. Please talk with your doctor if daily allergy medication is right for child to help with allergies.
