SECOND-HALF PERFORMANCE UPGRADE SPARKS CAVALIER HOMECOMING VICTORY

Crockett County head football coach Kevin Ward was not happy with his team's first-half effort in Friday night's homecoming game with Hardin County, despite holding a 21-12 lead but allowing 164 rushing yards.

Ward's mood improved after the second half when his Cavaliers held the visiting Tigers to 67 total yards, picked off two passes, shut them out, and tacked on a couple of touchdowns themselves to win 35-12.

"We were a much better football team in the second half," Ward said. "We tackled better, we blocked better, we executed our responsibilities much better instead of worrying about someone else's. With Haywood coming up next, we can't start out the same way we did in the first half tonight."

Ward pointed out to his team that the Tomcats - the region's gold standard team for the past few years - will be coming into Cavalier Stadium fresh off their first loss, a non-region 41-20 thumping by undefeated Covington.

"They're going to be hacked off when they get here," Ward said, "so we better be ready to go from the opening kick. They have size in the line, tremendous players in the skill positions, and two great quarterbacks that can both play. We'll have to see where we are injurywise and how we have to move some people."

The Cavs have been without lineman Zerafin Guardian for three games now and added lineman Colton Mayo to the list in the Hardin County contest.

While Ward touted the second-half play of his team Friday night, two guys definitely were ready for the opening bell. Running back DK Woods put on another bullish show against the Tigers, running for two first-half scores with 79 yards on 11 carries and gaining 20 more yards on his only pass reception. Kickoff return specialist Demo Pickens ran one all the way back for the second straight game, this time covering 90 yards to the end zone to give Crockett its 21-12 halftime edge.

Defensively, however, the Cavs allowed Hardin County to drive 91 yards in 17 plays - taking 9:20 off the first-quarter clock - for a touchdown on its opening possession. The visitors missed the extra point, and - with their tally sandwiched by two four-yard scoring runs by Woods - trailed 14-6.

But then Crockett allowed a 70-yard touchdown scamper by Jacob Saunders, but held a 14-12 edge when the extra point was again missed.

Pickens gathered in the ensuing kickoff at his 10, turned toward the middle, cut to the right, and zipped 90 yards without being touched. Avery Hurst booted the third of his five extra points on the night, and the Cavs led 21-12 at the intermission.

Following a halftime break that included an outstanding performance of the entire "Glitch" show by the Marching Cavaliers Band and a fireworks show from the north side of the campus, Crockett's defense returned to the field with a vengeance and stopped a fourth-andone play at the Hardin County 37. A pair of 12-yard runs by Woods moved the hosts to the five, but a fumbled exchange and an incomplete pass forced a field goal attempt.

Hurst lined up from 28 yards out, but the snap sailed well over the arms of holder Kris Phillips and Hurst had no choice but to fall on it for a 26-yard loss, ending the threat.

Crockett then stopped another fourth-down Tiger play, breaking up a pass at midfield. A pass interference call on a third-down play kept the Cavs' 50-yard drive going, and quarterback Ben Burgess hit tight end Dre Walker with a four-yard scoring pass with 8:29 remaining in the game. Hurst's extra put the Cavs up 28-12.

On the next Hardin County play from scrimmage – a pass about 20 yards downfield – safety Amarion Hobson nailed the intended receiver just as the ball reached him. Cav linebacker Jake Knox intercepted the deflected ball, igniting Crockett's final scoring drive.

Burgess connected with wideout Deuce Greenhill down the left sideline for 33 yards and then chopped off 17 more yards with a toss to Walker, down to the Tiger four. Gabe Dupree ran it into the end zone from there with 7:35 to go, and Hurst made it 35-12. Dupree later intercepted another Aidan Coleman pass on the game's final play to wrap up the homecoming triumph and improve the Cavs' record to 6-2 on the season.

Woods finished with 128 yards on 20 carries; Walker caught four passes for 65 yards and a score; and Burgess was eight-of 13 passing for 120 yards to head the Crockett statistical categories.
