WEST VALLEY CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT NAMES INTERIM SUPERINTENDENT

WEST VALLEY, NY – On Tuesday, August 13, the West Valley Central School Board of Education appointed Tracie Bliven as Interim Superintendent. This decision follows the resignation of Superintendent Dr. Taweepon Farrar, which was accepted at the Board of Education meeting on June 18, 2024. Dr. Farrar, who had served as Superintendent for the past three years, will now take on the role of District Superintendent at Orleans/Niagara BOCES. Ms. Bliven will officially started her role on August 14, 2024.

Board President Heather Klahn expressed gratitude for Dr. Farrar's service, stating, "We thank Dr. Farrar for her leadership and dedication over the past three years and wish her well in her new position at O/N BOCES. Since Dr. Farrar's resignation, the Board has been exploring collaborative opportunities with Franklinville Central School that we feel will greatly expand opportunities for our students, including the possibility of sharing a superintendent. Our exploration of greater opportunities for students does not include the tuitioning of students, merger, or closing of West Valley Central School. Ms. Bliven's appointment will allow the Board more time to consider this potential collaboration. We are confident that Ms. Bliven's extensive experience will greatly benefit our district during this period of exploration."

Ms. Bliven, who most recently served as Interim Director of Special Education at Genesee Valley Central School, brings a wealth of experience from her roles as Superintendent, Director, Principal, and Teacher in various districts, including Alfred-Almond, CA BOCES, Genesee Valley, and Scio.

The Board of Education will provide updates on the school website and through the school's social media channels.

A new school year is set to begin in just a couple of weeks. From the work of our Buildings and Grounds department to our teachers, we have been preparing for the first day of students on **Wednesday**, **September 4.** Whether it is a clean classroom, fresh coat of paint, or new lessons and curriculum, the purpose of these preparations is to always create strong foundations for our students to realize their full potential.

Our 7th Grade Orientation will be held on Tuesday, August 27 at 6:30 p.m. The purpose of this orientation is to communicate important information related to our Code of Conduct and Technology Acceptable Use Policy, distribute student devices, and have students become familiar with their new surroundings. We are asking that all students and their parent(s)/guardian(s) attend in order to participate in extra-curricular activities for the 2024-25 school year. (All students are currently eligible to participate in athletic practices that begin before orientation.) We believe that this orientation will help us to have a common understanding of what is needed for our students to realize their full potential as they transition from elementary to secondary school.

In closing, although the summer is almost over, it is exciting to know that our students will be filling our hallways in a few weeks, catching up with friends, settling into a routine, and learning! FINANCIAL AID NIGHT AT West Valley Central School

The 26th Annual Financial Aid Night will be held Monday, November 4 from 6:00-8:00 p.m. in the Auditorium. A representative from Jamestown Community College's Financial Aid Office will provide information for 11th and 12th graders and their parents/guardians on the financial aid process including completion of the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) forms, grants, scholarships, and various student and parent loans.

Financial aid is money that comes in many forms. It generally consists of a combination of grants (actual cash that you do not have to pay back), scholarships (actual cash awarded for academic achievement), and loans (must be paid back). These types of aid come from a variety of sources: the college itself, individual states, private donors,

and the Federal Government (by far the largest source of aid). Once you've filled out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA): <u>https://studentaid.gov/h/</u> <u>apply-for-aid/fafsa</u> colleges will extend to you the types of aid for which you are eligible.

WNY CONSORTIUM OF HIGHER EDUCATION COMMON RECRUITMENT - OCT. 9, 2024

The WNY Consortium Common Recruitment Committee is excited to visit and meet with our students this fall. The WNY Consortium is comprised of 20 colleges and universities across the Western New York region. On Wednesday, October 9 from 8:00-8:45 a.m. the WNY Consortium will be in the WVCS Auditorium. This is a free event for students in grades 10-12.

THE DIGITAL PSAT/NMSQT'S ARE TUESDAY, OCTOBER 22, 2024

On Tuesday, October 22, 2024, our school will administer the PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/ National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) for 10th and 11th graders using their own school-issued device or a device provided to them that day. The cost per student is <u>\$18.00</u>, and checks are to be made payable to WEST VALLEY CENTRAL SCHOOL. The *deadline* to sign up and pay for the test is **Friday, October 11, 2024**, in the Guidance Office or with Mrs. Westfall in the Main Office. Even if your child is not considering college now, they should take the PSAT/NMQST. Just taking it can encourage a student to start thinking seriously about life after high school, goals, and the education necessary to achieve those goals.

- 1. The test measures the reading, math, and writing skills needed for college (and for success in most jobs and careers in today's world). After the test, a score report will show the students' results in each of the sections. It will also target areas that need improvement before re-taking/taking the PSAT/SAT standardized tests.
- 2. This test gives students a chance to see how their skills compare with those of other students who will apply to college.
- 3. For 11th graders only, it is the first step in entering the National Merit Scholarship Corporation competitions for scholarships and recognition.
- 4. The Student Search Service gives PSAT/NMSQT test takers the option to voluntarily place their names and addresses in a pool of college-bound students interested in receiving admission and financial aid information from certified colleges, universities, and scholarship agencies.
- 5. Lastly, it provides practice for the SAT exams, which most juniors take for the first time in the spring.

GUIDANCE NEWS ASVAB CAREER EXPLORATION PROGRAM FOR 10TH-12TH GRADERS DECEMBER 6, 2024

West Valley Central School will be administering the ASVAB assessment instrument, which is part of the ASVAB Career Exploration Program (CEP), to any <u>interested</u> students in grades 10-12 on Friday, December 6 from 8:00-11:00 a.m. Please have your child sign up in the Guidance Office with Mr. LaBrake by Friday, November 15. This test is an invaluable tool to help your child with his/her future educational and career plans.

The ASVAB CEP will help your students:

- To learn more about themselves and the world of work
- Explore occupations in line with their interests and skills
- Develop an effective strategy to realize their career and education goals

One of the scores on the ASVAB is the military services' entrance score, which may be used by your child to explore career options in the military. Your child's name and ASVAB CEP Scores will be released to the military unless you choose not to have their name released. Even if your child's name is released to the military, by no means is your child obligated to any military branch. The ASVAB CEP's website <u>www.</u> <u>asvabprogram.com</u> offers useful information regarding the program and includes a brief video summary explaining the process and benefits of the program. 


