WVCS HEALTH CORNER

The illness season can be brutal for parents and kids alike. And when illnesses seem back-to-back, it is tricky to determine when it is safe and appropriate to send them back to the classroom or daycare.

Keeping kids home when they are contagious with illness is a critical way to reduce the spread of sickness to others. In addition, many viral illnesses suppress the immune system, making recovering kids more susceptible to new illnesses if they return to the classroom too quickly.

Not only are sick kids potentially spreading illness to others, but their day is also not effective or productive. Sick kids are not good learners. Humans are meant to rest and relax as the body fights disease. A busy classroom setting is not conducive to that recovery.

Most childhood illnesses follow a predictable pattern. Kids often begin their period of contagiousness one to two days prior to symptom onset and decrease the risk of spreading illness to others over time. Knowing these patterns is how we can determine when kids should be staying home from school or daycare.

A child must stay home from school with the following symptoms:

- Temperature over 100.0 Fahrenheit in the previous 24 hours
- Vomiting in the last 24 hours
- Diarrhea lasting more than a few hours
- Excessive coughing that is disruptive to others, or change in breathing patterns
- Untreated eye infection
- Severe headache or sore throat, especially if with fever
- Sharp, severe, or persistent abdominal pain
- Known positive for COVID-19
- Known positive for influenza
- Lice and scabies

A trip to the pediatrician's office is often recommended for kids who have a fever along with any focal pain (like ear or throat), or a known exposure to a contagious disease that may require treatment. In addition, if kids have severe symptoms of any type or the illness is lasting longer than expected, a doctor's visit is warranted. And, of course, anytime you are worried about your child, we expect you to visit or call the pediatrician's office.

Think about returning to class when your child's symptoms are improving. For most kids, these are the factors to look for before sending them back to school:

- Fever-free for at least 24 hours without any fever-reducing medication
- Regular eating habits, especially after any vomiting or diarrhea
- Return to regular sleeping habits, and a good night of sleep the night prior to returning to school
- Runny nose and cough that is not disruptive and easily manageable
- Return of a normal level of energy and playfulness that will allow for a productive day in the classroom

If you visit the pediatrician and get a diagnosis, certain childhood infections have their own return to school guidelines. Please always follow the pediatrician's orders and return to school guidelines.

WNY CONSORTIUM OF HIGHER EDUCATION COMMON RECRUITMENT - OCT. 9, 2024

The WNY Consortium Common Recruitment Committee is excited to visit and meet with our students this fall. The WNY Consortium is comprised of 20 colleges and universities across the Western New York region. On Wednesday, October 9 from 8:00-8:45 a.m. the WNY Consortium will be in the WVCS Auditorium. This is a free event for students in grades 10-12.

THE DIGITAL PSAT/NMSQT'S ARE TUESDAY, OCTOBER 22, 2024

On Tuesday, October 22, 2024, our school will administer the PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/ National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) for 10th and 11th graders using their own school-issued device or a device provided to them that day. The cost per student is §18.00, and checks are to be made payable to WEST VALLEY CENTRAL SCHOOL. The deadline to sign up and pay for the test is Friday, October 11, 2024, in the Guidance Office or with Mrs. Westfall in the Main Office. Even if your child is not considering college now, they should take the PSAT/NMQST. Just taking it can encourage a student to start thinking seriously about life after high school, goals, and the education necessary to achieve those goals.

- The test measures the reading, math, and writing skills needed for college (and for success in most jobs and careers in today's world). After the test, a score report will show the students' results in each of the sections. It will also target areas that need improvement before re-taking/taking the PSAT/SAT standardized tests.
- This test gives students a chance to see how their skills compare with those of other students who will apply to college.
- For 11th graders only, it is the first step in entering the National Merit Scholarship Corporation competitions for scholarships and recognition.
- 4. The Student Search Service gives PSAT/NMSQT test takers the option to voluntarily place their names and addresses in a pool of college-bound students interested in receiving admission and financial aid information from certified colleges, universities, and scholarship agencies.
- 5. Lastly, it provides practice for the SAT exams, which most juniors take for the first time in the spring.

ASVAB CAREER EXPLORATION PROGRAM FOR 10TH-12TH GRADERS DECEMBER 6, 2024

West Valley Central School will be administering the ASVAB assessment instrument, which is part of the ASVAB Career Exploration Program (CEP), to any <u>interested</u> students in grades 10-12 on **Friday, December 6 from 8:00-11:00 a.m.** Please have your child sign up in the Guidance Office with Mr. LaBrake by Friday, November 15. This test is an invaluable tool to help your child with his/her future educational and career plans.

The ASVAB CEP will help your students:

- To learn more about themselves and the world of work
- Explore occupations in line with their interests and skills
- Develop an effective strategy to realize their career and education goals

One of the scores on the ASVAB is the military services' entrance score, which may be used by your child to explore career options in the military. Your child's name and ASVAB CEP Scores will be released to the military unless you choose not to have their name released. Even if your child's name is released to the military, by no means is your child obligated to any military branch. The ASVAB CEP's website www.asvabprogram.com offers useful information regarding the program and includes a brief video summary explaining the process and benefits of the program. THE DENTON AND LEORA ALDROW MEMORIAL PARK

The Denton and Leora Aldrow Memorial Park, also referred to as "The Grove," is a picnic area in the woods behind the school and part of the 100+ acres of school district property. In 2000, the school district was given a monetary donation by the Denton and Leora Aldrow families to build, refurbish, expand, upgrade, and maintain that area of property. The remainder of the donation to the school district is to be used to maintain The Grove in its entirety and in perpetuity.

Construction of The

Grove began in 2003 with stone pillars, a restroom, picnic shelter with BBQ access, picnic tables, and covered bridge. The Grove was designed and built to resemble how the family remembered the area growing up.



Over the last few years, the district has had to put restrictions on the use of the picnic area due to misuse of property, vandalism, and use while school is in session. A gate was installed across the driveway to the


picnic area to limit vehicular traffic on school property. Vehicles, ATVs, and dirt bikes freely drive through The Grove to other areas of school property, causing damage to athletic fields and crosscountry running paths throughout the woods. Cameras have been installed in this area for accountability purposes and to deter misuse of The Grove.
