# ELEMENTARY SUMMER ENRICHMENT


This summer has been a blast! Our elementary students have had the opportunity to participate in a Summer Enrichment program at WVCS.

Students could come Monday through Thursday, or could choose a Monday/ Wednesday schedule, or a Tuesday/Thursday schedule. While at Enrichment, students participated in a variety of hands-on activities. Kindergarteners and first graders built windmills and made bird feeders after discussing different bird habitats and what birds eat. Second graders learned how to be an engineer and then designed and built walls that they later tested for strength. Then they applied their engineering skills to making a blanket fort during a camping themed day. They also reviewed their math skills while making a variety of projects. Third and fourth graders read the book The Dot and then built a tower using only index cards, dots, and scissors. Then they reflected on what they could do to make the tower taller, incorporating growth mindset and its school applications. They also used Plus-Plus Blocks and playing cards to practice multiplication. The fifth and sixth grade class engaged in many different activities including a States project, Decimal Fish, Canvas Art, and Fraction Name projects.

We tried our best to tailor the activities to the interests of the kids we had! In addition to all of this, students had the opportunity to go to PE every other day and a STEAM class every other day. They played new and exciting games with our gym teachers and conquered STEAM challenges with Mrs. Theil! They even made solar ovens and cooked s'mores in them. All in all, it has been a great summer!

# ENHANCED SAFETY AND VISITOR CHECK-IN PROCEDURES FOR 2023-24

The safety of all students, staff and visitors who work and learn at West Valley are our priority. We are excited to take next steps in ensuring a safe working and learning experience. Here are some highlights of our new visitor management system:

- Each visitor's government-issued ID card will be screened against the sex offender registries in all 50 states as well as an unlimited number of custom databases.
- When a visitor is flagged, staff can review the visitor's information
  - side-by-side with the offender's information immediately while notifications are sent to administrative and security personnel.
- Visitors to the school will be issued a temporary badge that shows their role, name, destination, date and time of entry, and photograph.





# PREPARING FOR SUCCESS!

A new school year is set to begin in just a couple of weeks. From the work of our Buildings and Grounds department to our teachers, we have been preparing for the first day of students on **Wednesday, September 6.**Whether it is a clean classroom, fresh coat of paint, or new lessons and curriculum, the purpose of these preparations is to always create strong foundations for our students to realize their full potential.

Our teachers have been working throughout the summer to further develop their

curriculums and instructional strategies. Specifically, we have completed our 3rd summer of ELA curriculum work. This summer has been devoted to assessing our students, collecting data, and adjusting our instruction based upon a variety of student measures. Similarly, in Math we have begun our 2nd year of curriculum alignment and will be specifically focusing on mathematical vocabulary and student assessment. Although the last few years we have focused on ELA and Math. this summer our teachers also began their work on aligning the Next Generation Science standards and how to adjust our instruction to meet the standard expectations.

While our teachers have been preparing throughout the

summer, we have also planned for two student-parent orientation events prior to the start of the school year. The purpose of these orientations is to communicate important information related to our Code of Conduct, Technology Acceptable Use Policy, and to distribute student devices. These orientations are on Tuesday, August 29 for 7th Grade only and Wednesday, August 30th for students in grades 8 through 12.

We are asking that all students and their parent(s)/ guardian(s) attend in order to participate in extra-curricular activities for the 2023-24 school year. All students are currently eligible to participate in athletic practices that begin before these orientations. Ultimately, we

believe that these orientations will help us to have a common understanding of what is needed for our students to realize their full potential at West Valley Central School.

In closing, although the summer is almost over, it is exciting to know that our students will be filling our hallways in a few weeks, catching up with friends, settling into a routine, and learning! Our 2023-24 student Bell Schedule has remained essentially the same with a minor adjustment to the morning homeroom times; see a copy in this newsletter. Please enjoy the rest of your summer and I look forward to seeing everyone after Labor Day!

# WNY CONSORTIUM OF HIGHER EDUCATION COMMON RECRUITMENT OCT. 4 • 10:15-11:00

The WNY Consortium Common Recruitment Committee is excited to visit and meet with our students this fall. The WNY Consortium is comprised of 20 colleges and universities across the Western New York region. On Wednesday, October 4, from 10:15-11:00 a.m. the WNY Consortium will be in the Aud. This is a free event and will target grades 10-12.

## NEW DIGITAL FORMAT PSAT/NMSQT OCTOBER 18

This fall the PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) will be **administered in a new digital format** that will provide an overall easier testing experience for students. On Wednesday, October 18, our school will administer the PSAT/NMSQT for 10th and 11th graders using their own school-issued device or a device provided to them that day. The cost per student is **\$18.00**, and checks should be made payable to WEST VALLEY CENTRAL SCHOOL. The **deadline** to sign up and pay for the test is **Tuesday, October 10**, in the Guidance Office or with Mrs. Westfall. Even if your child is not considering college now, they should take the PSAT/NMQST. Just taking it can encourage a student to start thinking seriously about life after high school, goals, and the education necessary to achieve those goals.

- 1. The PSAT measures the reading, math, and writing skills needed for college (and for success in most jobs and careers in today's world). After the test, a score report will show a student's results in each of the sections. It will also target areas that need improvement before re-taking/taking the PSAT/SAT.
- This test gives students a chance to see how their skills compare with those of other students who will apply to college.
- 3. For 11th graders only, it is the first step in entering the National Merit Scholarship Corporation competitions for scholarships and recognition.
- 4. The Student Search Service gives PSAT/NMSQT test takers the option to voluntarily place their names and addresses in a pool of college-bound students interested in receiving admission and financial aid information from certified colleges, universities, and scholarship agencies.
- 5. Lastly, it provides practice for the SAT exams, which most juniors take for the first time in the spring.

## **ASVAB CAREER EXPLORATION PROGRAM** FOR 10TH-12TH GRADERS WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 6

West Valley Central School will be administering the ASVAB assessment instrument, which is part of the ASVAB Career Exploration Program (CEP), to any **interested** students in grades 10-12 on Wednesday, December 6, from 8:00 to 11:00 a.m. Please have your son/daughter sign up in the Guidance Office with Mr. LaBrake by Friday, November 17. This test is an invaluable tool to help your child with his/her future educational and career plans.

The ASVAB CEP will help your students:

- To learn more about themselves and the world of work
- Explore occupations in line with their interests and skills
- Develop an effective strategy to realize their career and education goals

One of the scores on the ASVAB is the military services' entrance score, which may be used by your child to explore career options in the military. Your child's name and ASVAB CEP Scores will be released to the military unless you choose not to have their name released. Even if your child's name is released to the military, by no means is your child obligated to military service. The ASVAB CEP's website (www.asvabprogram.com) offers useful information regarding the program and includes a brief video summary explaining the process and benefits of the program. 
