The first few weeks of school have been filled with excitement, enthusiasm, and much West Valley Pride; with our fall athletic teams leading the way. I would like to thank our entire school community for the amazing turnout at Open House, participation throughout Spirit Week, Fall Fest, and our Homecoming Dance.

In the classroom, students and staff are working hard to achieve our goals for the year. Students have done an amazing job transitioning to our new cell phone policy. Thank you to students and families for your support. It has already made a positive impact in our classrooms and overall environment.

As we move forward in October, we are looking forward to the many learning opportunities for both students and staff; inside and outside of the classroom. We will continue our curriculum work in ELA. Math, and now Science through several days of professional development in October. The main goal of our professional development in ELA this year is to document and analyze student performance and to make specific instructional changes based on student performance. In Math, we are building assessments and data tools to use for analyzing student work and will continue to align our curriculums specifically focusing on math vocabulary. In Science, we are beginning to align our standards and content but will also be focusing on the implementation of the new Science 5 and Science 8 assessment.

Outside of the regular classroom we have much planned for our students in October. The WNY College Consortium will visit our school on October 4. On October 13 we will partner with the West Valley Volunteer Hose Company to provide Fire Safety education to our students in grades PK-4. We are also planning several trips such as Old Fort Niagara, Whitworth Planetarium, Randolph Fish Hatchery, and the Great Pumpkin Farm. Finally, we will end the month of October with our annual Halloween Parade on Tuesday, October 31st.

Although the school year just started, we are full steam ahead for our students. We look forward to continuing to offer our students opportunities in and outside of our school to provide the best experiences and education possible. School Board Recognition Week is a time to promote awareness and understanding of the important work performed by local school boards. The Superintendent (as CEO) focuses on MEANS - objectives, plans, actions, recommendations. How? When? Where? By Whom?

In other words, the board oversees the education of students and is responsible for school district operations but does not directly run the district's day-to-day operations.

Major responsibilities of a board member:

- Set the District's Direction drawing upon the community, the board describes a shared vision, and established goals, standards, and strategy to transform vision into reality.
- Ensure Alignment of strategy, resources, policies, programs, and processes with district goals.
- Assess & Account for Progress

 using comprehensive data, thorough deliberation, and open communication.
- Continuously Improve the district accentuating and reinforcing the positive and correcting the negative.

To represent well, to fulfill public trust, to lead...

- Steward of the district's resources.

- Advocate for public education.

MEET WEST VALLEY'S NEW SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER

The halls of West Valley Central School have welcomed a new face dedicated to ensuring the safety and well-being of its students – Deputy Angelia Johnson. With a background deeply rooted in Cattaraugus County and a passion for making a difference, Deputy Johnson brings a unique perspective to her role as a School Resource Officer (SRO).



Hailing from East Otto and a graduate of Cattaraugus-Little Valley, Deputy Johnson has

worn several hats throughout her career journey. She's worked as a school substitute, spent time on a blueberry farm during her high school days, and has also worked at Holiday Valley. She is now a full-time employee at the Cattaraugus County Sheriff's Office, where she found her calling in law enforcement. A graduate of Hilbert College with a bachelor's degree in forensic science and criminal investigation, she later honed her skills at the Chautauqua County Sheriff's Academy in Jamestown.

"I went into law enforcement because I wanted to help people on a different level other than a teacher or counselor," Deputy Johnson shared. She's not just about the badge, though—she enjoys the outdoors, cherishes quality time with friends and family, loves reading books, staying active, and proudly cheers on her Buffalo Bills.

In her role as an SRO, Deputy Johnson takes on various responsibilities, primarily ensuring the safety of everyone within the district. "I interact with students all throughout the day," she shared, "greeting them as they arrive, interacting in the hallways, cafeteria, classrooms, and even participating in physical education classes and other outdoor activities." Her dedication extends to ensuring the school is secure, though she emphasizes she's not a disciplinarian; rather, she's here to support staff, administration, and most importantly, the students. Throughout the year, she will be a familiar face at school events, open houses, and home sports games.

In Deputy Johnson's own words, her message to parents and guardians is simple: "I am here for a reason, and that is to make sure your children are safe. I'm here for them."



WNY CONSORTIUM OF HIGHER EDUCATION COMMON RECRUITMENT

The WNY Consortium Common Recruitment Committee is excited to visit and meet with our students this fall. The WNY Consortium is comprised of 20 colleges and universities across the Western New York region. On **Wednesday, October 4,** from 10:15-11:00 a.m. the WNY Consortium will be in the Aud. This is a free event and will target grades 10-12.

NEW DIGITAL FORMAT PSAT/NMSQT

This fall the PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/ National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) will be <u>administered in a</u> <u>new digital format</u> that will provide an overall easier testing experience for students. On Wednesday, October 18, our school will administer the PSAT/NMSQT for 10th and 11th graders using their own schoolissued device or a device provided to them that day. The cost per student is <u>\$18.00</u>, and checks should be made payable to WEST VALLEY CENTRAL SCHOOL. The <u>deadline</u> to sign up and pay for the test is **Tuesday, October 10,** in the Guidance Office or with Mrs. Westfall. Even if your child is not considering college now, they should take the PSAT/NMQST. Just taking it can encourage a student to start thinking seriously about life after high school, goals, and the education necessary to achieve those goals.

- 1. The PSAT measures the reading, math, and writing skills needed for college (and for success in most jobs and careers in today's world). After the test, a score report will show a student's results in each of the sections. It will also target areas that need improvement before re-taking/taking the PSAT/SAT.
- 2. This test gives students a chance to see how their skills compare with those of other students who will apply to college.
- 3. For 11th graders only, it is the first step in entering the National Merit Scholarship Corporation competitions for scholarships and recognition.
- 4. The Student Search Service gives PSAT/NMSQT test takers the option to voluntarily place their names and addresses in a pool of college-bound students interested in receiving admission and financial aid information from certified colleges, universities, and scholarship agencies.
- 5. Lastly, it provides practice for the SAT exams, which most juniors take for the first time in the spring.

FEEDMORE WNY WEEKEND BACKPACK PROGRAM

If any family wishes to participate in our **Weekend Backpack Program**, please contact Mr. LaBrake anytime during the school year. The goal of the Weekend Backpack Program is to provide nutritious and easy-to-prepare meals for children to take home on the weekends. This program is provided to you **completely free of charge!**

Each week your child will be provided with a bag of nutritious, nonperishable food to be eaten over the weekend. The food will be placed in your child's backpack at the end of the school day, and it is intended to be opened once your child is home. The program will continue throughout the 2023-24 school year. Participation in the Weekend Backpack Program will not affect your family's eligibility for other food assistance programs (such as SNAP, WIC, or food pantry access).

ASVAB CAREER EXPLORATION PROGRAM For 10th-12th graders Wednesday, december 6

West Valley Central School will be administering the ASVAB assessment instrument, which is part of the ASVAB Career Exploration Program (CEP), to any <u>interested</u> students in grades 10-12 on Wednesday, December 6, from 8:00 to 11:00 a.m. Please have your son/daughter sign up in the Guidance Office with Mr. LaBrake by Friday, November 17. This test is an invaluable tool to help your child with his/her future educational and career plans.

The ASVAB CEP will help your students:

- To learn more about themselves and the world of work
- Explore occupations in line with their interests and skills
- Develop an effective strategy to realize their career and education goals

One of the scores on the ASVAB is the military services' entrance score, which may be used by your child to explore career options in the military. Your child's name and ASVAB CEP Scores will be released to the military unless you choose not to have their name released. Even if your child's name is released to the military, by no means is your child obligated to military service. The ASVAB CEP's website (<u>www.asvabprogram.com</u>) offers useful information regarding the program and includes a brief video summary explaining the process and benefits of the program.
