A solar eclipse will be visible in New York State on the afternoon of April 8, 2024. New York will be one of eleven contiguous U.S. states situated within the path of totality for the total solar eclipse. Several regions of the state will be in the direct path of totality. Other parts will be able to view a partial solar eclipse. This presents a unique educational opportunity for students to learn about this exciting astronomical event, and an ideal teachable moment for teachers to delve into the wonders of the



cosmos. The next total solar eclipse will not happen in New York again until 2079.

Although our students are not in school on this day, we believe this experience will be exciting for our community. Please use caution when viewing the eclipse with the naked eye and take all precautions. We are thankful to Cattaraugus-Allegany BOCES for providing our students with eclipse glasses. We will be sending these glasses home with our students at the end of March, right before our Spring Break begins on March 29th.

# PREPARING FOR NYS ASSESSMENTS

The month of March begins one of the longer uninterrupted stretches of the school year.

We are excited for the opportunity to have our students demonstrate their growth when the NYS 3-8 ELA, Math, and Science assessments will be given in early April and May, respectively. For the 2024 spring administration of these assessments, all students in grades 5-8 will be taking them on a computer (Computer Based Testing: CBT). This is a state-mandated transition required for grades 5 and 8, but we



have elected for grades 6 and 7 to also test on computer. Grades 3 and 4 will continue to test on paper for this year.

In the 2022-23 school year West Valley was designated as a school in good standing across all student groups. One of the keys that allows us to be a school in good standing is our NYS 3-8 Assessment participation rate (the number of students who take the assessments).

Over the last two years we have had 100% and 99% of our students take the assessments. The data from assessments has been helpful in determining our professional development focus for the upcoming year. We recently used the last few years of assessment data to focus on specific skills and concepts in English Language Arts and Math. It continues to be critical that all of our students participate in state assessments to allow us the best opportunity to adjust to meet student needs.

The science assessments in 5th and 8th grade are new this year and have been aligned to the NYS Science Learning Standards. In preparation, students have been completing required Science Investigations (mini labs) in grades 3 through 8. The change to the science assessments will continue into high school level Earth Science and Biology in the 2024-25 school year.


# FEEDMORE WNY WEEKEND **BACKPACK PROGRAM**

# ARE YOU INTERESTED IN RUNNING FOR THE BOARD OF EDUCATION?

**Petitions** to be a candidate for a board of education seat are available beginning March 19 in the district office from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, except holidays.

There is one (1) seat open for election to the Board of Education, a **Five-year term**, currently held by Tracy Chai (term expires on June 30, 2024). If elected to this seat your term will start July 1, 2024.

The petition requires signatures and residences of at least 25 qualified voters. On the petition the candidate's name and residence should be on each page of the petition.

Signed petitions must be filed with Carolyn Boberg, District Clerk, by 5:00 p.m. on April 22, 2024.

# To qualify to be a board candidate you must meet the following criteria:

- A citizen of the United States,
- Eighteen (18) years of age or older,
- Able to read and write,
- A legal resident of the district for a continuous and uninterrupted period of at least one (1) year prior to the election,
- Cannot be an employee of the West Valley Central School District,
- The only member of his/her family (that is, cannot be a member of the same household) on the West Valley Central School District Board.
- May not simultaneously hold another incompatible public office, including, but not limited to Superintendent, clerk, tax collector, treasurer or librarian, or an employee of the Board. In union free and central school districts, however, a Board member may be appointed clerk of the board and of the district.
- Must not have been removed from a school district office within one (1) year preceding the date of appointment or election to the Board.

#### SCHOOL DISTRICT TAX CODE NUMBER

The New York State resident income tax returns (IT-200 and IT-201) require you to enter the name and code number of the public school district where you were a resident as of December 31 for the tax year 2023. The school district name and code for entry on state income tax forms are:

<u>District Name</u>: West Valley Central School District <u>District Code</u>: 690

It is important to put this number on your tax return because it helps determine the amount of State Aid we receive for the school district.

### **WVCS HEALTH CORNER**

MARCH: NATIONAL NUTRITION MONTH

Good Nutrition: This is something that sounds so easy to do but at times feels so difficult to achieve. Today's world does not always support or even provide us with good nutritional options. It is important to understand the value of proper nutrition and why what we eat is crucial.

So, what is nutrition? To put it straight, it is the process of providing our bodies with food for health and growth. The "nutrients" in our food are what give our bodies energy and help us heal. It is essential for good health and is the critical part of how well our body functions. Better nutrition is related to improved infant, child and maternal development, as well as a stronger immune system; it also lowers the risk of non-communicable diseases (such as diabetes and heart disease). Plus, it promotes life longevity.

Here are five easy ways to eat healthy this month:

- Water Drinking the recommended amount of water per day is tough. Electrolyte additives offer the same, if not better benefits than drinking six or more glasses of water a day would
- 2. Choose food over supplements Most nutrients our bodies need come from food, not store-bought supplements. Research shows that certain supplements haven't been tested to meet many purity and safety standards, making them an unreliable source of nutrition. However, there are some people who truly lack certain vitamins and minerals that cannot be achieved through diet alone.
- 3. Add color Natural color, such as bright greens from crunchy vegetables or vibrant reds from tangy fruits, will not only make your meal picture-worthy, but they will also give you a healthy boost.
- 4. Pack your lunch Packing your lunch daily helps to prevent buying restaurant or fast-food loaded with grease. Even more important is the ability to control portion sizes when you pack your own lunch.
- 5. Shop Smart When shopping at the supermarket stick to the outside aisles. This ensures that you are getting healthy alternatives to processed foods like produce, meat, and dairy. When you move inward, most, if not all the products contain unnecessary additives and sugar.
