### **BUDGET PROPOSITION**

PROPOSITIONS FOR THE ANNUAL SCHOOL BUDGET, PURCHASE OF A 21-PASSENGER SCHOOL BUS WITH 3 WHEELCHAIR CAPABILITY (AND RELATED EQUIPMENT) FUNDED BY THE TRANSPORTATION RESERVE FUND, AND BOARD MEMBER VOTE will be held on Tuesday, May 21, 2024, from noon until 9:00 p.m. in the Library Conference room.

The district will again rent electronic voting machines from Cattaraugus County.

### PERSONAL REGISTRATION

Registration will be held in the district office on May 7 from 3-7:00 p.m. Please bring personal identification and proof of address with you to register. You may register for state, county, and school elections online at the Department of Motor Vehicles website https://dmv.ny.gov/more-info/electronic-voter-registrationapplication. If you are interested in only voting in the school elections you can either call the District Clerk at 716-942-3100, ext. 4102 or come to Personal Registration on May 7.

If you are not registered with the county or the school, you may not cast a ballot. Please take the time to register; everyone's vote is important. If you are in doubt, call Carolyn Boberg, District Clerk, at 716-942-3100 ext. 4102 to determine your status.

#### If you have voted in recent years your name will be on the list. To qualify to vote, you must be:

- 1. a citizen of the United States,
- 2. eighteen (18) years of age or older,
- 3. a resident within the district for a period of thirty (30) days preceding the next meeting at which he/she offers to vote,
- 4. a college student whose legal residence is in the school district,
- 5. listed on the Registration of Voters list for West Valley Central School District, which is provided by the Cattaraugus County Board of Elections or listed with the District to only vote for school propositions, which is kept on file in the District Clerk's office.

### **ABSENTEE BALLOTS**

West Valley Central School District is required by law to make absentee ballots available to qualified district voters for the May 21, 2024, Annual School Budget, purchase of a 21-Passenger Bus with 3 wheelchair capability (funded by the Transportation Reserve Fund), and board member election. Call Carolyn Boberg, District Clerk, at 716-942-3100 ext. 4102 for an application or question.

A qualified district voter must request in advance an **application** for **absentee ballots** and select the reason you will not be able to appear in person on May 21, 2024, to vote in person on this day. Reasons include:

- (a) are/or will be a patient in the hospital, or unable to appear personally at the polling place on such day because of illness or physical disability or,
- (b) duties, occupation, business, or studies will require him/ her to be outside of the country/county or city of their residence on such day, or
- (c) on vacation outside the country/county or city of his residence on such day; or,
- (d) absent from his voting residence because detained in jail awaiting action by a grand jury or awaiting trial or is confined in prison after conviction for an offense other than a felony.

The district clerk must receive the *application* at least seven days before May 21, 2024 (if the ballots need to be mailed to you); this will give ample time to be returned to the district). Completed absentee ballots will be accepted by Carolyn Boberg until 5:00 p.m. on May 21, in the District Office.

#### What to know about Seasonal Allergies

Spring is (finally) in the air, but now you are not feeling so well. Do you feel like you always get a cough, runny nose, and itchy, watery eyes at certain times of the year? You may have just called it a cold or the flu. However, it is likely you have seasonal allergies.

Seasonal allergies, also called hay fever or allergic rhinitis, are more common than you think. Millions of people in America suffer from this condition every year. As the seasons change and there is warmth in the air, this triggers the growth of plants and mold. The plants and mold then release tiny, microscopic pollen and spores into the air. When you breathe in pollen and spores, it can cause inflammation, irritation, and other symptoms.

The symptoms of seasonal allergies can be minor like sneezing a few times a year. But for some, seasonal allergies can cause congestion; a runny nose; itchy, watery eyes; and headaches for weeks or months at a time. Common seasonal allergy signs and symptoms include:

- Itchy, watery, or red eyes
- Circles under eyes
- Itchy mouth, nose, or throat
- Runny or stuffy nose
- Drainage from the nose down the back of the throat (postnasal drip)
- Temporary loss of smell
- Headache
- Sneezing
- Dry cough
- Tiredness (due to difficulty sleeping from other symptoms)
- Scratchy or sore throat (rarely)
- Snoring (due to congestion)

To find out if you have seasonal allergies a primary care physician or an allergy specialist can give you an official diagnosis. Often this includes allergy testing.
