

For the project, students selected and learned about famous people they would like to portray. Their subjects were a diverse collection including athletes, political figures, historical figures, and more. The students read from a variety of sources and collected facts about their individual's childhood, education, life, and accomplishments. The students wrote and typed a research report based on their research. Then students created note cards to use for their oral presentations at the Wax Museum. It was a collaborative project worked on in class and at the library.

For the museum, they dressed as their subjects and stood as still as wax figures. Guests touring the museum were encouraged to "push" buttons created by each child, at which time the "wax" figure would become animated, sharing a summary describing their famous person.






PHYSICS AND MUSIC


OUTDOOR TRACK & FIELD RECORD BOARD UNVEILED
