CAPITAL PROJECT/ FACILITIES/SAFETY

In the Main Office, demolition is completed, studs are up, and drywall is almost done. The foundation has been poured for the new secure entryway. The steel will be going up soon. Lockers on the first floor are gone and the old lockers will be temporarily re-installed on the second floor. We anticipate the new lockers coming and being installed over Christmas Break. Hallways will be painted as well. The tentative finish date is still by the end of year minus a few back ordered items. The next few weeks will be spent getting the new offices "blocked" off so students and staff can use the main hall. The main entry point will continue to be the current main doors. No other doors will be used for entry or exit points for students. Parents, guardians, and visitors will continue to use the main entryway if there is a need to come to the building. Staff will be required to enter from the rear doors in the back of the building. All doors will remain locked during the school day.



TEMPORARY STUDENT DROP OFF AND PICK UP PROCEDURES

While construction is ongoing, West Valley Central School will operate under new temporary drop-off and pick-up procedures.

Building Access:

All students and visitors must enter and exit through the current main doors as the single point of entry for the building.

Drop-Off Procedures:

7:00-7:25 a.m.

Parents may use the "Bus Loop" to drop off children at the Main Doors.

7:25-7:36 a.m.

This time is designated for bus drop-off. Parents arriving during bus drop-off must wait until all buses have left the "Bus Loop."

Pick-Up Procedures:

Before 2:41 p.m.

Elementary students dismissed to the bus.

Elementary Walkers & Riders delay until buses leave.

2:44 p.m. Buses depart

2:45 p.m.

Walkers and riders dismissed and may be picked up once the "Bus Loop" is cleared.






Any seniors interested in attending a college (Fall of 2023) that requires the SAT's who have not tested, or wish to test again, should test either August 27th or October 1st.

Registering for the SAT

When you register for the SAT online, it is very important that you write down all your passwords



You must provide a photo with your registration, which will become part of your admission ticket. If you are not easily recognizable in your photo, you will not be admitted to the test center.

Cost Information

The SAT costs **\$60.00** for the regular registration deadline. The optional SAT Essay is discontinued for the weekend SAT. Late registration deadlines cost an additional **\$30.00**.

ACT

Cost Information

ACT with Writing costs \$88.00 and the late fee is \$36.00. Students must check with individual colleges to see if they will accept the ACT "No Writing" exam for \$63.00.

Registration

You will need a credit card to register online. If a student thinks they might qualify for a fee-waiver, email Mr. LaBrake before applying for the ACT's.

As part of ACT's test security requirements, you must now provide a recent photo of yourself in order to complete your test registration. This photo will be used for identification and test security purposes. This photo will print on your ticket and on

WNY CONSORTIUM OF HIGHER EDUCATION COMMON RECRUITMENT FALL 2022 - 10/6/2022 - 10:15-11:00 A.M.

The WNY Consortium Common Recruitment Committee is excited to visit and meet with our students this fall. The WNY Consortium is comprised of 20 colleges and universities across the Western New York region. On Thursday, October 6, 2022, from 10:1511:00 a.m. the WNY Consortium will be in the AUD. This is a free event and will target grades 10-12.

PSAT'S ARE WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 12, 2022

On Wednesday, October 12, 2022, our school will administer the PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/ National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) for 10th and 11th graders. The cost per student is \$18.00, and checks are to be made payable to WEST VALLEY CENTRAL SCHOOL. The *deadline* to sign up and pay for the test is **Monday, October 3, 2022,** in the Guidance Office or with Mrs. Westfall. Even if your child is not considering college at this time, he or she should take this test. Just taking it can encourage a student to start thinking seriously about life after high school, goals, and the education necessary to achieve those goals.

- The PSAT measures the reading, math, and writing skills needed for college (and for success in most jobs and careers in today's world). After the test, a score report will show the students' results in each of the sections. It will also target areas that need improvement before re-taking/taking the PSAT/SAT standardized tests.
- This test gives students a chance to see how their skills compare with those of other students who will apply to college.
- For 11th graders only, it is the first step in entering the National Merit Scholarship Corporation competitions for scholarships and recognition.
- 4. The Student Search Service gives PSAT/NMSQT test takers the option to voluntarily place their names and addresses in a pool of college-bound students interested in receiving admission and financial aid information from certified colleges, universities, and scholarship agencies.
- 5. Lastly, it provides practice for the SAT exams, which most juniors take for the first time in the spring.

Please encourage your children to sign up for the PSAT/NMSQT. The time to start thinking about further education beyond high school is now!

24TH ANNUAL FINANCIAL AID NIGHT - WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 19, 2022, AT 6:00 P.M.

On Wednesday, October 12, 2022, our school will administer the Please attend the "24th Annual Financial Aid Night" at West Valley Central School at 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, October 19, 2022. A representative from Jamestown Community College's Financial Aid Office will provide information for 11th and 12th graders and their parents/guardians on the financial aid process including: completion of the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) forms, grants, scholarships, and various student and parent loans.

Financial aid is money that comes in many forms. It consists of a combination of grants (actual cash that you do not have to pay back), scholarships (actual cash awarded for academic achievement), and loans (must be paid back). These types of aid come from a variety of sources: the college itself, individual states, private donors, and the Federal Government (by far the largest source of aid). Once you've filled out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA): http://www.fafsa.ed.gov/ colleges will extend to you the types of aid for which you are eligible.

ASVAB CAREER EXPLORATION PROGRAM FOR 10TH - 12TH GRADERS -WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 7, 2022

West Valley Central School will be administering the ASVAB assessment instrument, which is part of the ASVAB Career Exploration Program (CEP), to any <u>interested</u> students in grades 10 - 12 on **Wednesday**, **December 7**, **2022**, **from 8:00 to 11:00 a.m.** Please have your son/daughter sign up in the Guidance Office with Mr. LaBrake by Friday, November 18th. This test is an invaluable tool to help your child with his/her future educational and career plans.

The ASVAB CEP will help your students:

- To learn more about themselves and the world of work
- Explore occupations in line with their interests and skills
- Develop an effective strategy to realize their career and education goals

One of the scores on the ASVAB is the military services' entrance score, which may be used by your child to explore career options in the military. Your child's name and ASVAB CEP Scores will be released to the military unless you choose not to have their name released. Even if your child's name is released to the military, by no means is your child obligated to the military service.

The ASVAB CEP's website www.asvabprogram.com offers great information regarding the program and includes a brief video summary explaining the process and benefits of the program. Please call me with additional questions, 716-942-3100, extension 4148. Thank you.


