Just as a community looks to its school board for wise decisions, firm commitments, and steady achievements, board members look to their president for strong leadership. Effective board presidents understand the responsibilities of the position and their role on the governance team.

A school board is required by law to elect a president and may elect a vice president at its discretion. Elections occur at the annual organizational meeting, and normally include a nomination process. Your school board procedures will indicate the process for nominating and electing the board president and vice president.

The board president's authority is essentially no greater than that of any other board member. The president will still participate in all board actions as a regular voting member. The board president does not

lose the ability to vote and is expected to vote on every matter before the board.

The responsibilities of the **school board president** require this individual to be organized, decisive, and an effective communicator. The president must listen with an open mind, delegate responsibilities to foster board engagement and act with a clean focus on the district's vision and mission. The board president's responsibilities typically include:

- The voice of the board
- Mediate conflict
- Create a meeting agenda in consultation with the superintendent
- Signing the necessary instruments, acts, and orders
- Ensure compliance with the open meetings law

The **school vice president** has the power to exercise the duties of the president should the president be absent due to illness, work or family commitments, or a vacancy in the position. Expectations of this position typically include:

- A key part of the leadership team
- Stay informed & abreast of all communication
- Participate in agenda setting
- Help manage the business meeting
- Remain in the loop between the board president and superintendent
- Carry out duties without interruption if president is unable to do so.

WEST VALLEY CROSS COUNTRY

The West Valley Cross Country Team is having a phenomenal season this year!

Meet the Team

The team has grown to include 13 athletes representing our modified and varsity program. This year's Varsity Boys' Team is led by Jack Tharnish who ran over 200 miles this summer in preparation for the Cross Country season. Jack has been running Cross Country since 7th Grade bringing not only experience but leadership. Jack regularly gets our other athletes into a routine and sets the bar high for everyone. This year he has seen substantial gains proving that hard work pays off. Currently, Jack is ranked 14/159 in the CCAA league.

Nick Peters is new to cross country, but it would be hard to tell based off his amazing times. Nick initially started out as a sprinter in track and field running the 100/200/400-meter dash. He has shifted into an impressive endurance athlete putting up very competitive times.

Noah Klahn started this year out as a modified boys runner, but after his first race, he stated that he wanted to take the placement test to get into varsity. He succeeded and has helped our West Valley cross country program have the 5 members required to compete as a team. Noah set his personal best at 20:55 and is working tirelessly to get his PR down.

Rounding out the Boys' Varsity Team are Josh Kowalski and Slater Smith. Josh and Slater both participated in the program last year and have shaved nearly 4 minutes off their times from last year. Both are year-round athletes participating in cross country, basketball, and track and field.

Leading the Girls' Team is Olivia Harmony. Olivia also trained over the summer and continued to see improvement in her times. This is her first year as a varsity athlete with the team. She took a firstplace finish at the 28th annual Alleghany Limestone invitational and has had many top 5 finishes this year. Olivia is ranked 7/113 in the CCAA league. Of the Class D only schools she is ranked first.

Olympia Leckey is the only senior this year and her successes were celebrated at the West Valley senior night home meet on October 11th. She has made impressive gains this year shaving over a minute off in just a months' time. She is ranked 45/113 in the CCAA League.

Victoria Parish is another seasoned athlete having competed in Cross Country since 7th Grade. Victoria brings a positive spirit and encouragement to her teammates with some amazing finishing times as well. Victoria's sister Maggie is dual sporting this year as a swimmer and a cross country athlete. She is a persistent athlete and gives every ounce of effort at our meets.

Our modified athletes include Sebastian Froland, Osias Leckey, Emma Arent, and Calypso Leckey. With each meet their times improve as does their determination to succeed.

Home XC Meet

This has been a successful year for our Cross-Country athletes and program. Over the summer many of the athletes came out to put in our first ever 5k trail. This required over a mile of new trails to be constructed in The Grove. The athletes raked out the minimally fourfoot-wide path, cleared the path of debris, roots, and helped to level off spots that could be hazardous to runners. After months of work and the help of school staff and the community the trail was done just in time for West Valley's inaugural home meet. The runners put up amazing times. Olivia Harmony's finish was exceptional, taking first place for girls' varsity and finishing 3 minutes and 42 seconds before the next nearest competitor. Her girls' varsity course record is set at 21:39, a testament to our challenging terrain. The meet was a great success and could not have happened without the help of the athletes, parents, school, and community at large.



West Valley Central School will be administering the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) assessment instrument, which is part of the ASVAB Career Exploration Program (CEP), to any **interested** students in grades 10 - 12 on **Wednesday**, **December 7, 2022,** from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Please have your son/daughter sign up in the Guidance Office with Mr. LaBrake by **Friday, November 18th.** This test is an invaluable tool to help your child with his/her future educational and career plans.

The ASVAB CEP will help your students:

- To learn more about themselves and the world of work
- Explore occupations in line with their interests and skills
- · Develop an effective strategy to realize their career and education goals

One of the scores on the ASVAB is the military services' entrance score, which may be used by your child to explore career options in the military. Your child's name and ASVAB CEP Scores will be released to the military unless you choose not to have their name released. Even if your child's name is released to the military, by no means is your child obligated to the military service.

The ASVAB CEP's website <u>www.asvabprogram.com</u> offers valuable information regarding the program and includes a brief video summary explaining the process and benefits of the program. Please call me with additional questions, 716-942-3100, extension 4148. Thank you.
