



Below are guidelines for West Valley Central School's playground.

- Adult supervision is required at all times.

PARENTS AS READING PARTNERS (PARP)

The Parents As Reading Partners (PARP) program ran for two weeks from Monday, May 8th until Friday, May 19th. The theme this year was dinosaurs—"Welcome to Jurassic PARP!" Students received a calendar with activities such as wearing a shirt with words, reading to a pet or stuffed animal, wearing a hat ("hats off to books"), and several others that added to the fun of celebrating reading.

Students were encouraged to read for at least 20 minutes every night and fill out a reading log. Each morning they got a stamp in their log and a ticket to enter for raffle prizes. For each night they read, students also earned tickets to spend at the carnival! This was the culminating event held in the gym on Friday.

Every student also got to pick a new book to keep, enjoyed a scavenger hunt in the PARP hallway, and could choose to do a book swap.

Congratulations to all of the students who participated and a big thank you to the NHS and NJHS students, 6th graders, and high school students who helped out at the carnival. This would never be a successful program without support from the staff and the parents. We're already looking forward to next year!

ART CORNER

It's hard to believe how fast the year flew by! It must be true when they say, "time flies when you're having fun!" And it's sure been a lot of fun in the art room!

In the elementary school, our pre-schoolers made beautiful Mother's Day gifts, printing their hands to make Irises. Kindergarten students painted with Q-Tips and also made flowers for their mothers, placing them in lovely vases. The 5th grade just completed a project with a focus on an animal of their choice, zentangles, and the study of habitats. They designed their names with black and white zentangles while filling the background with contrasting bright and bold colors. Their name was placed inside of an animal body, illustrating the animal in their natural environment. Sixth graders studied pop art and created a self portrait in the style of pop art. They incorporated ben-day dots, a technique named after Benjamin Henry Day and made famous by artist Roy Lichtenstein. Lastly, our seventh graders have been really studying "how to see" and are drawing an animal of their choice in four different viewpoints. Doing this practice helps students learn how to study a form from different angles.

Students in photography learned the three pillars of photography—shutter speed, aperture, and ISO. They experimented with long exposure photography creating light paintings in the dark. It was a fun and interactive way to play with photography. Our animation class is rounding out the course, working on completing their independent projects. They have the option to choose between flipbooks, paper cuts, claymation, or stop motion. The students have shown a lot of growth with this pilot program and it's been a wonderful elective for West Valley to offer. Sculpture students are having a lot of fun working on their sculptured puns. Some chosen puns to look forward to are "dino-soar, deviled egg" and

"superbowl." Finally, our drawing and painting students have been working on intuitive, symmetrical drawings. They experimented with watercolor to make a symmetrical painting and are now being inspired by their artistic flow to illustrate images within their paintings.

We hosted our annual district art show on May 16, celebrating each Vallian artist and showcasing a wide range of two-dimensional, three-dimensional, and digital artwork. The night was filled with artistic and interactive stations and it was a delight to see students showing off their artwork to their families.

Lastly, we would like to celebrate senior Benjamin Fisher as our Celebrity Artist of the Month. He plans on attending SUNY New Paltz after graduation as a computer science major. His favorite color is red and he loves chicken finger subs. "Ben is one of the most hard working students I've known with a good head on his shoulders. He certainly has a unique sense of creativity in the art room and I love his different viewpoints," says art teacher Hannah Mazzuto.
