




The students had a great time reviewing and building on their skills!























INTRODUCING XELLO (FORMERLY CAREER CRUISING) TO PARENTS/GUARDIANS

Last January we merged all our students in grades K-12 into the software guidance planning tool, Xello. This online program helps K-12 students determine future goals and plans to achieve them. It helps them explore options and create a plan

for their future college experience and the world of work. This summer, Xello developed a new family portal inviting parents and guardians to view their child's future goals and plans.

Say hello to Xello!

Xello is an engaging online program that helps students build the skills, knowledge and plans to be future ready. The program uses an investigative, discover-based learning process. Students better understand themselves, their future career options, and the 21st century skills they'll need to succeed.

Here's how it works...

The Student Experience with Xello

With Xello, your child will:

1. Build Self-knowledge

Define their interests, skills, preferences, and aspirations so they can explore the opportunities right for them.

2. Explore options

Learn about career possibilities and educational pathways by exploring rich, engaging content and lessons.

3. Create a Plan

Your child can create dynamic actionable plans that outline the steps needed to achieve school, career, and life goals.

4. Learn & Reassess

Interactive lessons help your child develop age appropriate skills and knowledge for success in school and beyond.

Parent Involvement

You're encouraged to explore Xello with your child by logging in together. Your child can log in to his or her account via desktop or mobile device to share what they've learned about themselves, the world of work, and their future options.

Safe and Secure Environment

We take data protection and privacy very seriously. So does Xello. The program complies with legal requirements for safety and security outlined in the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). That means advertising is not displayed within Xello, nor is data used for commercial purposes. Xello is also a signatory of the Student Privacy Pledge, requiring them to uphold strict standards for safeguarding student privacy regarding the collection, maintenance, and use of student personal information.

PSAT'S

On Tuesday, October 26, 2021, our school will administer the PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/ National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) for 10th and 11th graders. The cost per student is \$18.00, and checks are to be made payable to WEST VALLEY CENTRAL SCHOOL. The *deadline* to sign up and pay for the test is **Monday, October 18, 2021** in the Guidance Office or with Mrs. Westfall. Even if your child is not considering college at this time, he or she should take this test. Just taking it can encourage a student to start thinking seriously about life after high school, goals, and the education necessary to reach those goals.

- 1. The PSAT measures the reading, math, and writing skills needed for college (and for success in most jobs and careers in today's world). After the test, a score report will show the students' results in each of the sections. It will also target areas that need improvement before re-taking/taking the PSAT/SAT standardized tests.
- 2. This test gives students a chance to see how their skills compare with those of other students who will apply to college.
- 3. For 11th graders only, it is the first step in entering the National Merit Scholarship Corporation competitions for scholarships and recognition.
- 4. The Student Search Service gives PSAT/NMSQT test takers the option to voluntarily place their names and addresses in a pool of college-bound students interested in receiving admission and financial aid information from certified colleges, universities, and scholarship agencies.
- 5. Lastly, it provides practice for the SAT exams, which most juniors take for the first time in the spring.
- 6. Please encourage your son or daughter to sign up for the PSAT/NMSQT.

The time to start thinking about further education beyond high school is *now!*

BOARD OF EDUCATION CORNER

Over the summer, Scott Payne, CA BOCES Superintendent and Tim Cox, CA BOCES Assistant Superintendent, facilitated a board retreat for the West Valley CSD Board of Education. Dr. Taweepon Farrar, Superintendent was also in attendance. The board spent several hours reviewing board roles and responsibilities. The board also discussed draft board norms (a guidance for the board of education to follow) and goals that will be discussed further with the community and staff, these were finalized at the August 24th board meeting and will be shared soon. The mission and vision statements were reviewed, and the district will involve stakeholders (residents) during the next school year to update the statements to ensure all voices are heard for updates to these statements. The Board of Education will strive to accomplish that district decisions will be made with "no surprise" approach. ASVAB CAREER EXPLORATION

West Valley Central School will be administering the ASVAB assessment instrument, which is part of the ASVAB Career Exploration Program (CEP), to any <u>interested</u> students in grades 10-12 on Wednesday, December 1, 2021 from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Please have your son/daughter sign up in the Guidance Office with Mr. LaBrake by Friday, November 19. This test is in an invaluable tool to help your child with his/her future educational and career plans.

The ASVAB CEP will help your student:

- To learn more about themselves and the world of work
- Explore occupations in line with their interests and skills
- Develop an effective strategy to realize their career and education goals

One of the scores of the ASVAB is the military services' entrance score which may be used by your child to explore career options in the military. Your child's name and ASVAB CEP scores will be released to the military unless you choose not to have their name released. Even if your child's name is released to the military, by no means is your child obligated to military service.

The SAT with Essay costs \$55.00 for the regular registration deadline. The optional SAT Essay is discontinued for weekend SAT. Late registration deadlines cost an additional \$30.00. Other "SAT Fee" information (i.e., SAT Subject Tests, scores by phone, extra score reports to a college, test center and date changes, etc.) is available at http://sat.collegeboard.org/register/sat-fees.

In order to register for the SAT Exam, use the following website: www.sat.org/register. It is very important that when a student applies for the SAT online that they write down all their passwords and print a copy of the confirmation page (last page); this is the admission ticket for the day of the test. If a student has test modifications, please see Mr. LaBrake before applying for the SAT.

Select which scores you want to send to your score recipients on-line through the following website: http://sat.collegeboard.org/register/sat-score-choice. Score Choice gives you the option to choose which scores you send to colleges — in accordance with an institution's stated score-use practice. If you decide not to use Score Choice, all your scores will be sent to your recipients. Students should still feel comfortable sending all scores, since most colleges consider a student's best score.

You must provide a photo with your registration, which will become part of your Admission Ticket. If you are not easily recognizable in your photo, you will not be admitted to the test center: http://sat.collegeboard.org/register/photo-requirements.

Any seniors interested in attending a college (Fall of 2022) that requires the SAT's who have not tested, or wish to test again, should test either August 28th or October 2nd.

ACT with Writing costs \$85.00 and the late fee is \$36.00. Students must check with individual colleges to see if they will accept the ACT "No Writing" exam for \$60.00. Other "ACT Fee" information (i.e., refunds, test center and date changes, etc.) is available at www.actstudent.org/regist/actfees.html. To register online for the ACT, go to www.actstudent.org.

You will need a credit card to register online. If a student has test modifications and/or thinks they might qualify for a fee-waiver email Mr. LaBrake before applying for the ACT's.

As part of ACT's test security requirements, you must now provide a recent photo of yourself in order to complete your test registration. This photo will be used for identification and test security purposes. This photo will print on your ticket and on the score report that is automatically sent to your high school. Photos are valid for two years: http://www.actstudent.org/regist/add-photo.html.

With online registration you:

- Register for the ACT 24/7
- Know immediately whether your preferred test center has space for you to test
- View your scores at no charge
- Print your admission ticket

23RD ANNUAL FINANCIAL AID NIGHT TUESDAY, OCT. 19, 2021 AT 6:00 P.M.

A representative from Jamestown Community College's Financial Aid Office will provide information for 11th and 12th graders and their parents/guardians on the financial aid process, including completion of the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid), grants, scholarships, and various student and parent loans.

Financial aid is money that comes in many forms. It generally consists of a combination of grants (actual cash that you do not have to pay back), scholarships (actual cash awarded for academic achievement), and loans (must be paid back). These types of aid come from a variety of sources: the college itself, individual states, private donors, and the Federal Government (by far the largest source of aid). Once you've filled out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at http://www.fafsa.ed.gov/ colleges will extend to you the types of aid for which you are eligible.
