MESSAGE FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT

Spring is here! When we think of spring we think of sunny skies, flowers blooming, trees budding and greener grass. I could not think of any more symbolism than spring for what's to come for West Valley. This is our chance for renewal and growth. This is a time for beginning again and embracing new things.

Facilities

The capital project passed! I thank each of you who came out to vote and I personally am excited for our students for this opportunity. The major focus of the project will be enhancing and improving our facilities with a focus on safety and security. The planning process is beginning, and I will keep you informed as we move along through the project schedule. The capital outlay project was just approved by New York State so those improvements will begin as soon as possible. The SmartSchools Bond Act Project to improve the technology infrastructure is also beginning.

Budget

Ann O'Brien, our business official, has been presenting the budget to the Board of Education. She will continue to present and work on the school budget over the next several weeks. As of now, we are waiting for New York State to share with us their final budget for schools. Until we get this information, we will not have a final budget. School boards must adopt a budget by April 27th so we will have our school budget completed before then. I encourage you to attend the April board meetings to learn more.

Academics

We will begin as a district to start evaluating and looking at our current academic program specific to curriculum and instruction. We need to ensure that we are setting those learning expectations for what all students should know and be able to do based on the New York State learning standards. With that being said, we need everyone's help: administrators, teachers, students, and parents/guardians to support the state assessments. These assessments help us as a school learn what we need to do better to support our students. The United States Department of Education (USDE) has made the determination that the assessments are

still required. The USDE has waived the accountability requirements and has offered states flexibility in administering the tests. So while there are no consequences to a district for having high opt outs for the 2020-2021 school year, the data garnered from the results of the assessments are one data point among many that we can use to build a stronger academic program. The original intent of state assessments was to evaluate a school's program and that's exactly why I am encouraging students to take the assessment this year so we can become better!

Athletics

We are excited to have both softball and track here at West Valley this spring season! I know our community is proud to have these teams back at our school. In my first few weeks here and meeting our students and staff, I can say that the West Valley pride is strong! SCHOOL DISTRICT TAX CODE NUMBER

The New York State resident income tax returns (IT-200 and IT-201) require you to enter the name and code number of the public school district where you were a resident as of December 31 for the tax year 2020. The school district name and code for entry on state income tax forms are: **West Valley Central School District** and **690**. It is important to put this number on your tax return because it helps determine the amount of State Aid we receive for the school district.

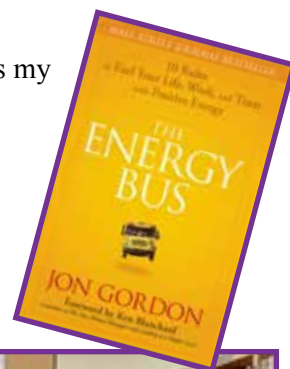

WEST VALLEY STUDENTS READY TO "SHOW WHAT THEY KNOW"

MR. DANIEL AMODEO, PRE-K-12 PRINCIPAL/CURRICULUM COORDINATOR

We have come a long way since the late summer of 2020 when we were not sure what school would look like in September. With the support of our entire school community we have been able to provide 100% In-Person learning for almost the entire year. It has not been easy but it is something we have been able to accomplish by working together to solve problems along the way.

Starting April 19th, we have the exciting opportunity to see the fruits of our labor. Students in schools across the state will begin taking assessments in ELA, Math, and Science. This year's state assessments will be much different than in year's past due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

For the 3-8 ELA and Math Assessments students will only have one day (1 Session) of testing for each subject. ELA assessments can occur any day between April 19th-April 29th. Math assessments can be given between May 3rd- May 14th. Similar adjustments have been made to the 4th and 8th grade Science assessments and the number of required Regents exams has been reduced to four: Algebra I, Earth Science, Living Environment, and ELA.

Throughout the last several years, the number of students who have not taken the 3-8 assessments has been significant. When we do not have all our students take the assessments it negatively impacts our school. The state assessments are an opportunity for our students to "Show What They Know," provide our teachers with valuable information on how and what to improve, and an opportunity for our school to show our progress.

Having all our students taking the assessments this year is critical in providing us with the information we need to adjust our curriculum and instruction. It will assist us in addressing the potential negative impacts the pandemic may have had on the learning of our students, your children. I love this school, our students, and staff. My heart is filled with West Valley pride and the desire for us to be the best school possible. All students doing their best is an opportunity for them to "Show What They Know" and how much we have grown. The second graders have been studying the westward expansion of the United States. Each child made their own “quilt” squares made from information for each lesson we learned. Their quilts were displayed in the hallway. They made covered wagons, travel trunks and pioneer toys (doll and spinner), and painted a log house (that will become a bird house). They also had to choose 10 items that they would pack for their trip and create a poster. We have been very busy in the art room! All students in Kindergarten through fifth grade have been working on self-portraits. They learned about proportion and the placement of facial features. Afterwards, Kindergarteners learned about mosaics and creating their own St. Patrick's Day shamrocks. Our elementary students have also been working on their three-dimensional skills, sculpting clay figures out of model magic. They ranged from winter themes to animals.

Our high school sculpture students have been working on their building skills, creating "big heads" of themselves out of paper mache. We are now learning about the artist Louise Nevelson and emulating her assemblage designs. Eighth graders are learning about Solomon LeWitt and his take on conceptual art. They participated in their own collaborative wall art, designing circles from the same set of directed instructions, but left up to them for interpretation. Sixth graders have created their own versions of self-portraits, but in Minecraft mode! This lesson taught a lot about math and symmetry while incorporating the Minecraft theme.

Our student of the month is high school senior Kyle Hickey. His favorite subject is woodworking and he loves to sleep. He enjoys the novel "Animal Farm," the movie "Inception," and pizza. "Kyle has always been a hard-working student in the art room," says teacher Mrs. Mazzuto. "He is always up for a new challenge and has shown growth throughout his high school career." ARE YOU INTERESTED IN RUNNING FOR THE BOARD OF EDUCATION?

Petitions to be a candidate for a board of education seat are available beginning March 17, 2021, in the district office from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, except holidays. **Signed petitions must be filed with Carolyn Boberg, District Clerk by 5:00 p.m. on April 19, 2021.**

When the petition is picked up, you will need to **identify what specific seat** you would like to run for. There are three seats open for election to the Board of Education. The seats are currently held by Timothy Ploetz (term expires on June 30, 2021), **five-year term**, Brad Frank

(appointed to seat due to resignation), **one year remaining on original term** and Amanda Lawrence (appointed to seat due to resignation), **three years remaining on original term**. The petition requires signatures and residences of at least 25 qualified voters. On the petition the candidate's name and residence should be on each page of the petition.

To qualify to be a board candidate you must meet the following criteria:

- A citizen of the United States,
- Eighteen (18) years of age or older,
- Able to read and write,
- A legal resident of the District for a continuous and uninterrupted period of at least one (1) year prior to the election,

- Cannot be an employee of the West Valley Central School District,
- The only member of his/her family (that is, cannot be a member of the same household) on the West Valley Central School District Board,
- May not simultaneously hold another incompatible public office, including, but not limited to Superintendent, clerk, tax collector, treasurer or librarian, or an employee of the Board.
 - o In union free and central school districts, however, a Board member may be appointed clerk of the Board and of the District.
- Must not have been removed from a school district office within one (1) year preceding the date of appointment or election to the Board.



IN PERSON REGISTRATION

Registration will be held in the district office on **May 6th from 3:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m.**

Please bring personal identification and proof of address with you to register. You may also register online at the Department of Motor Vehicles website at:

<https://dmv.ny.gov/more-info/electronic-voter-registration-application>

If you are not registered, you may not cast a ballot. Please take the time to register, everyone's vote is important. If you are in doubt, call Carolyn Boberg, District Clerk at 942-3100 ext. 4102 to determine your status.

If you have voted in recent years your name will be on the list.

To qualify to vote, you must be:

- (1) a citizen of the United States,
- (2) eighteen (18) years of age or older,
- (3) a resident within the District for a period of thirty (30) days preceding the next meeting at which he/she offers to vote,
- (4) a college student whose legal residence is in the school district,
- (5) on the **Personal Registration of Voters** list for **West Valley Central School District** which is provided by the Cattaraugus County Board of Elections.

ABSENTEE BALLOTS

West Valley Central School District is required by law to make absentee ballots available to qualified district voters for our May 18th, 2021 Annual Budget Vote, proposition to approve a bus/vehicle reserve and board members election. Call Carolyn Boberg, District Clerk at 942-3100 ext. 4102 for an application or question.

A qualified district voter must request in advance an **application** for **absentee ballots** and select the reason you will not be able to appear in person on May 18th, 2021 to vote in person on this particular day.

- (a) are/or will be a patient in the hospital, or unable to appear personally at the polling place on such day because of illness or physical disability or,
- (b) duties, occupation, business or studies will require him/her to be outside of the country/county or city of their residence on such day, or
- (c) on vacation outside the country/county or city of his residence on such day; or,
- (d) absent from his voting residence because detained in jail awaiting action by a grand jury or awaiting trial or is confined in prison after conviction for an offense other than a felony.
- (e) COVID concern

The district clerk must receive the **application** at least seven days before May 18th, 2021 (**if the ballots need to be mailed to you), this will give ample time to be returned to the district**). Completed absentee ballots will be accepted by Carolyn Boberg until 5:00 p.m. on May 18th, in the District Office.

ANNUAL BUDGET, PROPOSITION FOR BUS/VEHICLE RESERVE AND BOARD MEMBER VOTE

Will be held on **Tuesday, May 18th, 2021 from noon until 9:00 p.m.** in the **WVCS GYMNASIUM**. This location will provide enough room to socially distance. Face masks are required, and temperatures will be taken upon arrival.

The district will again rent the electronic voting machines from Cattaraugus County.

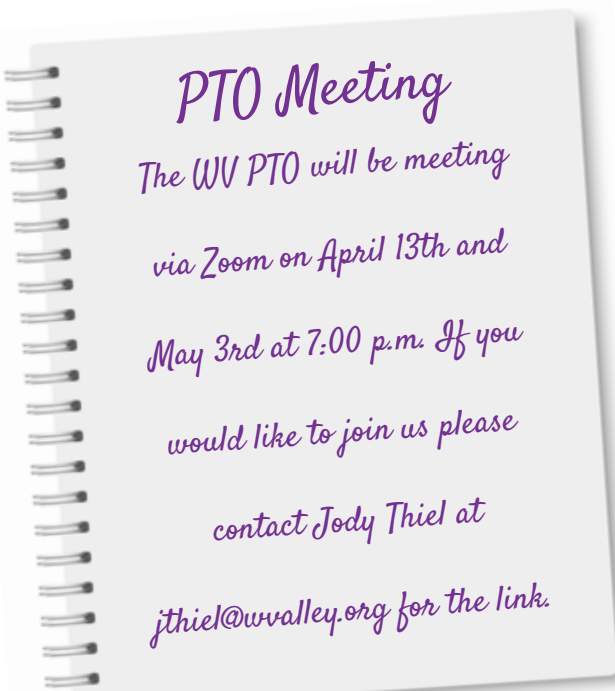
