

NEW FLAGPOLE AT WEST VALLEY


A new flagpole was installed outside the school on April 15 by Ace Flag from Depew, NY. The sidewalk and landscaping around the new pole will be completed by May 1.

I have spent the first two months taking the time to meet individually with every board member and staff member while also meeting with several community members. I want to personally take this opportunity to thank each of you for taking the time to meet with me and your willingness to share your stories. I felt it was important to learn more about each person and their journey with West Valley. I have had the pleasure to talk with several students and will continue to get to know all students. Every conversation has been such a valuable experience. These meetings are the foundation of developing good relationships and have been vital to providing critical input that will make West Valley the best it can be.

Facilities __

Our new flagpole was installed, and it is beautiful! As a veteran of the United States Navy, the pride I feel seeing the American flag flown proudly in the front lawn of our district, is simply hard to put into words. Thank you to Bill Sloand, Barry Mahnk, Ace Flag and the town for your work on this project. From now until the Fall of 2021 is where most of the planning will take place for the capital project. The winter of 2022 is when we will solicit contractors for the work to begin in spring of 2022. The district along with the architects/ construction managers have met with user groups to garner input from various stakeholders specific to what will be in this project. At these meetings, the architects asked questions, asked for input and suggestions, and showed examples/pictures to help facilitate the conversations. The architects will take all the input and begin to develop initial drawings of the work to be done. Once these drawings are made up, we will reconvene the user groups. The Smartschools bond project, with upgrades to the technology infrastructure in the building, will occur simultaneously with the capital project. The capital outlay project (yearly project) for 20-21 will include upgrades to some masonry work around the building and this work will start very soon. The capital outlay

project for 21-22 will consist of upgrades to all the classroom doors. The district will be developing a 5-year plan specific to facilities. Once this plan is done, it will be easier for the school community to know what's up-and-coming for the facilities improvements.

Budget ——

The district has worked very hard over these last few weeks to build a budget that is fiscally responsible, given the enacted budget by New York State. Our focus has been building in resources to build and improve our academic program in addition to our facilities. A separate newsletter will be sent out with specific details related to the budget. We need the community support on the budget to move our district forward for our students!

Finally, I want to thank Bob Harrington for taking the time over the last several weeks showing me the entire West Valley school district, and giving me the context of the important job that our bus drivers have of getting our students to and from school. Given all that I have learned so far, West Valley is truly the hidden gen of the Southern Tier!



SPECIAL EDUCATION NEWS

Greetings West Valley Families!

I hope you enjoyed the break and had time to rest and reconnect. I wanted to update you on an opportunity for our students during the summer. We will be providing summer school through Cattaraugus-Allegany BOCES from July 6, 2021-August 13, 2021. The classes will be held in the Pioneer school district from 8:30 a.m. - 2:30 p.m. daily and transportation will be provided by WVCS. These classes are available for our students currently in a special education classroom to support their learning through the summer. The class will be discussed in your child's CSE meeting as to whether your student would benefit from summer. If your student is receiving summer services, there will be more information sent home closer to the

end of the year. There are currently no special education summer school services offered at West Valley, so we are appreciative of the occasion to participate through BOCES.

It's that time again to register for Pre-K or kindergarten if your child is eligible. If your child has physical or educational needs or you suspect that your student may benefit from additional supports, you may be entitled to special education and related services, without cost to you. Please contact the Special Education Department at 942-3100 extension 4150, via email, or write to West Valley Central School, attention Special Education Department, 5359 School Street, West Valley, NY 14141, to request a referral packet. Services can include speech therapy, occupational therapy, physical therapy, or counseling as well as additional academic supports.

Finally, we are continuing our yearly review of IEPs through CSE meetings. Your child may have already had a CSE review or will have one before the end of the school year. If you have concerns and your child has already had a CSE meeting for this year, please contact the Special Education Department and we can schedule a meeting before the end of the school year. Meetings are held via Zoom or phone, pending updated guidance regarding Covid safety measures.

Congratulations to a strong last quarter, thank you all for your continued support.



STUDENTS TO TAKE REGENTS EXAMS IN JUNE

There have been a lot of discussions over the last few months regarding students and exams. There were discussions at the state and federal level about the possibility of canceling exams this school year. In last month's newsletter we shared that students in grades 3-8 would be taking the NYS Assessments in ELA and Math this year. The information gathered from these assessments is extremely important to know what opportunities for improvement there are for next year and the impacts of the COVID-19.

Our students will also be participating in the regular administration of June Regents exam beginning June 17th. Although West Valley will be giving Regents Exams we will only be giving the four that are required under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). These exams include Algebra 1, Earth Science, Living Environment, and ELA. A draft of the June Regents Exam and Final Exam schedule is included in this newsletter. The primary purpose of assessments is to know how well students learned and how well we did as teachers preparing them. While we are only required to give the four required Regents Exams, we will also be providing students with an opportunity to show what they have learned in their other courses through end of the year assessments.

Throughout the fourth quarter we will continue preparing our students for mastering the standards or the key skills and concepts they need to know for a grade level or course. One of our priorities and goals at West Valley is continuous improvement. We want our students to continuously improve, but to do that we as a staff need to improve how we are teaching and how students are learning. The information gathered from assessments is extremely important. Help us to encourage your children, our students, to do their best on every assessment. We are looking forward to a successful conclusion to the school year and the next opportunity to improve.

NURSE LINDSEY'S NEWS

HELP STOP THE SPREAD OF COVID-19



It is up to us to take steps to protect children and others from

getting sick. Help stop the spread of COVID-19 by doing the same things everyone should do to stay healthy. Teach your children to do the same. Here are some simple steps taken directly from the CDC website!

- Clean hands often using soap and water or alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Avoid people who are sick (coughing and sneezing).
- Clean and disinfect high-touch surfaces daily in household common areas (like tables, hard-backed chairs, doorknobs, light switches, remotes, handles, desks, toilets, and sinks).
- Launder items including washable plush toys as needed. Follow the manufacturer's instructions. If possible, launder items using the warmest appropriate water setting and dry items completely. Dirty laundry from an ill person can be washed with other people's items.
- Limit time with other children (practice social distancing) The CDC has updated guidelines for school social distancing to 3 feet. However, practicing 6 feet is still a smart idea. Social distancing is key to slowing the spread of COVID-19. The goal is to limit contact as much as possible. Be cautious when scheduling play dates, sports, and other activities and remind your child to practice social distancing.
- Wear a mask Children 2 years and older should wear a cloth face covering their nose and mouth when in the community setting. This would be especially important in the event that someone is infected but does not

have symptoms. Medical masks and N-95 respirators are still reserved for healthcare workers and other first responders, as recommended by current CDC guidance.



CELEBRATING NURSES

What is National Nurse's week?

National Nurses Week begins each year on May 6th and ends on May 12th, which is Florence Nightingale's birthday. Florence Nightingale was a nurse who became famous for treating wounded soldiers during the Crimean war, and for her work in establishing nursing as a profession. In the year 1998, May 8 was designated as National Student Nurses Day, to be celebrated annually. And as of 2003, National School Nurse Day is celebrated on the Wednesday within National Nurses Week (May 6-12) each year.

Why do we celebrate Nurse's Week?

The nursing profession has been supported and promoted by the American Nurses Association (ANA) since 1896. Each of ANA's state and territorial nurses' associations promotes the nursing profession at the state and regional levels. Each conducts celebration on these dates to recognize the contributions that nurses and nursing make to the community. All different types of nurses contribute to their communities in a myriad of ways all year round, this week is the time for these communities to show their support back to the nursing profession! Do you have a special nurse involved in your health care? Don't forget to show them support the next time you visit your health clinic or doctor's office!

Registration will be held in the district office on May 6th from 3:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m.

Please bring personal identification and proof of address with you to register. You may also register online at the Department of Motor Vehicles website at:

If you are not registered, you may not cast a ballot. Please take the time to register, everyone's vote is important. If you are in doubt, call Carolyn Boberg, District Clerk at 942-3100 ext. 4102 to determine your status.

If you have voted in recent years your name will be on the list.

To qualify to vote, you must be:

- (1) a citizen of the United States,
- (2) eighteen (18) years of age or older.
- (3) a resident within the District for a period of thirty (30) days preceding the next meeting at which he/she offers to vote,
- (4) a college student whose legal residence is in the school district,
- (5) on the **Personal Registration of Voters** list for **West Valley Central School District** which is provided by the Cattaraugus County Board of Elections.

ABSENTEE BALLOTS

West Valley Central School District is required by law to make absentee ballots available to qualified district voters for our May 18th, 2021 Annual Budget Vote, proposition to approve a bus/vehicle reserve and board members election. Call Carolyn Boberg, District Clerk at 942-3100 ext. 4102 for an application or question.

A qualified district voter must request in advance an **application** for **absentee ballots** and select the reason you will not be able to appear in person on May 18th, 2021 to vote in person on this particular day.

- (a) are/or will be a patient in the hospital, or unable to appear personally at the polling place on such day because of illness or physical disability or,
- (b) duties, occupation, business or studies will require him/her to be outside of the country/ county or city of their residence on such day, or
- (c) on vacation outside the country/ county or city of his residence on such day; or,
- (d) absent from his voting residence because detained in jail awaiting action by a grand jury or awaiting trial or is confined in prison after conviction for an offense other than a felony.
- (e) COVID concern

The district clerk must receive the *application* at least seven days before May 18th, 2021 (if the ballots need to be mailed to you), this will give ample time to be returned to the district). Completed absentee ballots will be accepted by Carolyn Boberg until 5:00 p.m. on May 18th, in the District Office.
