

MEMORIAL DAY 2021

The community gathered at the West Valley circle to commemorate Memorial Day in honor of our fallen heroes.

A successful season concluded on June 21st, as the Wildcats finished up their first season in six years. Finishing the season at 1-14, our record did not show the growth and determination the girls had in growing as a

Throughout the year, the team stuck together and really grew into a competitive force in the county. We were honored by the CCAA East Division League with the Sportsmanship award. Leah Seltzer was recognized as a team leader in sportsmanship.

Also receiving All-Star recognition were Sophomore Lauren Frascella who was selected to the 1st team and Sophomore Colleen Keller who was selected to the 2nd team. Senior Leah Seltzer received honorable mention recognition.

The team would like to thank everyone who came out to support them this season. We're looking forward to the same support next year as we continue to grow our program!

WEST VALLEY TRACK & FIELD

The West Valley Track & Field team finished the season with a record of 4-2. "We were so happy with how the team came together and surprised with how well we did," said one member of the team. "I couldn't be prouder of



these boys and girls," said Coach Schiumo. "They showed up every day and worked hard. They were part of something amazing this year and they battled their hearts out." The team had wins against Cattaraugus Little Valley, Salamanca, Forestville, and Gowanda.

The team was able to send 10 of its 13 athletes to Randolph for the Division III meets in which the boys' team placed in 9 out of 12 events they were entered in and the girls placed in 3 of 5, winning 2.

The girls were led again by sophomore Janay Ghani who won the 100-meter dash and the 200-meter dash. Eighth grader Onnalee Caswell placed 6th in the 400-intermediate hurdles and seventh grader Olivia Harmony ran a personal best in the 1500-meter run with a time of 5:47.

The boys were led by sophomore Chris Amodeo who won the 400-meter dash with a time of 52.6 and placed 2nd in the 100-meter dash. He finished 3rd in the 200-meter dash and the long jump with a jump of 18'2". Eighth grader Jack Tharnish finished 4th in the 1600-meter run with a time of 5:11 and 5th in the 3200-meter run with a time of 11:50.9. Senior Rodney Boberg placed 3rd in the intermediate hurdles with a time of 1:06.8. Sophomore Nolan Spencer finished 3rd with a personal best discus throw of 95'10". Freshman Jadon Schoepflin finished 6th with a personal best shot put of 36'7.5".

We are so excited for the future of our program and cannot wait to see what our athletes are able to accomplish in years to come. These athletes have been role models in the school and the community. This is only the beginning!

WEST VALLEY ATHLETICS

This wraps-up another year of West Valley Athletics! We made some big strides this year in the athletic department and it couldn't have been done without the support of everyone. In the Fall we had 5 athletes competing in Swim and Soccer. In the Spring we were able to create a Varsity Softball team for the first time in six years as well as a Varsity Track & Field team. We had over 30 athletes participating in interscholastic athletics in the Spring. We continue to look for avenues to grow the athletic program. With supporting programs such as the summer sports camp, intramurals, Boys on the Right Track, and Girls on the Run, we are very excited with the potential of creating more athletic teams in the future.

In the fall, West Valley will have its own Cross-Country team. We will also be combining with Springville Griffith Institute for Girls' Swimming and Girls' Volleyball. We are excited to combine with Holland for Boys' and Girls' Soccer. The start date for ALL fall athletic programs is August 23. Please make sure all appropriate paperwork is turned in prior to the start date.

A special congratulations to our award winners this year. Seniors Rodney Boberg and Zach Schoepflin were recipients of the Kristen Hintz Memorial Track & Field Award. Senior Leah Seltzer and Sophomore Nolan Spencer were recipients of the Roger Crandall Heart & Hustle Award. These awards provide scholarship money for the recipients to further their education.

Thank you to all who have supported West Valley Athletics this year. Our community is a special place that supports our student athletes beyond the classroom and we're so excited to expand and provide opportunities for our student-athletes.
