CONSORTIUM OF HIGHER EDUCATION

On Thursday, October 3, 2019, in the Auditorium, from 10:00 am to 10:45 am, the Western New York Consortium of Higher Education (which consists of 20 colleges) will visit West Valley Central School. The colleges that will be in attendance are two and four-year, private or public institutions. The college representatives will talk with our students regarding future academic opportunities. This is an excellent chance for 10th - 12th grade students to either begin thinking about "higher" education (i.e. gathering lots of free materials and asking questions) or confirming their choices of what college they wish to attend next fall. The colleges attending are: Alfred State College, Alfred University, Bryant and Stratton College, Buffalo State College, Canisius College, Daemen College, D'Youville College, Erie Community College, Fredonia State College, Genesee Community College, Hilbert College, Houghton College, Jamestown Community College, Medaille College, Niagara County Community College, Niagara University, Saint Bonaventure University, Trocaire College, University at Buffalo, and Villa Maria College.

2019 PSAT/NMSQT Registration Announcement

On Wednesday, October 16, 2019, our school will administer the PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/ National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) for 10th and 11th graders. The cost per student is **\$17.00**, and checks are to be made payable to WEST VALLEY CENTRAL SCHOOL. The *deadline* to sign up and pay for the test is **Friday, October 11, 2019** in the Guidance Office. Even if your child is not considering college at this time, he or she should take this test. Just taking it can encourage a student to start thinking seriously about life after high school, goals, and the education necessary to reach those goals.

- 1. It measures the reading, math, and writing skills needed for college (and for success in most jobs and careers in today's world). After the test, a score report will show the students' results in each of the sections. It will also target areas that need improvement before re-taking/taking the PSAT/SAT standardized tests.
- 2. This test gives students a chance to see how their skills compare with those of other students who will apply to college.
- 3. For 11th graders only, it is the first step in entering the National Merit Scholarship Corporation competitions for scholarships and recognition.
- 4. The Student Search Service gives PSAT/NMSQT test takers the option to voluntarily place their names and addresses in a pool of college-bound students interested in receiving admission and financial aid information from certified colleges, universities, and scholarship agencies.
- 5. Lastly, it provides practice for the SAT exams, which most juniors take for the first time in the spring.

The 21st Annual Financial Aid Night In OCTOBER!!!

Please attend the "21st Annual Financial Aid Night" at West Valley Central School. At 6:00 pm on Wednesday, October 9, 2019, in the cafeteria, Christopher Cartmill (Director of Financial Aid from Saint Bonaventure University) will provide information for 11th and 12th graders and their parents on the financial aid process including; completion of the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) forms, grants, scholarships, and various student and parent loans.

Financial aid is money that comes in many forms. It generally consists of a combination of grants (actual cash that you do not have to pay back), scholarships (actual cash awarded for academic achievement), and loans (must be paid back). These types of aid come from a variety of sources: the college itself, individual states, private donors, and the Federal Government (by far the largest source of aid). Once you've filled out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) via the internet (http://www.fafsa.ed.gov/) colleges will extend to you the types of aid for which you are eligible.

The SAT with Essay costs **\$64.50** for the regular registration deadline. Late registration deadlines cost an additional **\$30.00**. Other "SAT Fee" information (i.e. SAT Subject Tests, scores by phone, extra score reports to a college, test center and date changes...etc.) is available at http://sat.collegeboard.org/register/sat-fees.

In order to register for the SAT Exam use the following website: www.sat.org/register. It is very important that when a student applies for the SAT's online that they write down all their passwords, and print a copy of the confirmation page (last page); this is the admission ticket for the day of the test. If a student has test modifications and/or thinks they qualify for a fee-waiver please see Mr. LaBrake before applying for the SAT's.

Select which scores you want to send to your score recipients on-line through the following website: http://sat.collegeboard.org/register/sat-score-choice. Score Choice gives you the option to choose which scores (by test date for the SAT and by individual test for SAT Subject Tests™) you send to colleges — in accordance with an institution's stated score-use practice. If you decide not to use Score Choice, all of your scores will be sent to your recipients. Students should still feel comfortable sending all scores, since most colleges consider a student's best score.

You must provide a photo with your registration, which will become part of your Admission Ticket. If you are not easily recognizable in your photo, you will not be admitted to the test center: http://sat.collegeboard.org/register/photo-requirements.

Any seniors interested in attending a college (**fall of 2020**) that requires the SAT's who have not tested, or wish to test again, should test either the **August 24th** or **October 5th**.

Information about the SAT's are available in the Guidance Office. See Mr. LaBrake for assistance with registering for the SAT's.

ACT with Writing costs \$67.00 and the late fee is \$30.00. Students must check with individual colleges to see if they will accept the ACT "No Writing" exam for \$50.50. Other "ACT Fee" information (i.e. refunds, test center and date changes...etc.) is available at www.actstudent.org/regist/actfees.html. To register online for the ACT, go to www.actstudent.org.

No test centers are scheduled in New York for July 18th of 2020.

You will need a credit card to register online. If a student has test modifications and/or thinks they might qualify for a fee-waiver see Mr. LaBrake before applying for the ACT's.

As part of ACT's <u>test security requirements</u>, you must now provide a recent photo of yourself in order to complete your test registration. This photo will be used for identification and test security purposes. This photo will print on your ticket and on the score report that is automatically sent to your high school. Photos are valid for two years: http://www.actstudent.org/regist/add-photo.html.

- Register for the ACT 24/7
- Know immediately whether your preferred test center has space for you to test
- View your scores at no charge
- Print your admission ticket

Required Notification Regarding the Release of Student Information

According to Board of Education policy #7540, the District shall publish an annual public notice informing parents of eligible students of their right to refuse the release of student information. This test is in an invaluable tool to help your student with his/her future educational and career plans.

The ASVAB CEP will help your student:

- · To learn more about themselves and the world of work
- · Explore occupations in line with their interests and skills
- Develop an effective strategy to realize their career and education goals

One of the scores of the ASVAB is the military services' entrance score which may be used by your student to explore career options in the military. Your child's name and ASVAB CEP Scores will be released to the military unless you choose not to have their name released.
