

Dear and Parents/Guardians,

West Valley Central School will be administering the ASVAB assessment instrument, which is part of the ASVAB Career Exploration Program (CEP), to any <u>interested</u> students in grades 10-12 on Thursday, December 6th from 8:00 AM to 11:00 AM. Please have your son/daughter sign up in the Guidance Office with Mr. LaBrake by Friday, November 9th. This test is in an invaluable tool to help your student with his/her future educational and career plans.

The ASVAB CEP will help your student:

- To learn more about themselves and the world of work
- Explore occupations in line with their interests and skills
- Develop an effective strategy to realize their career and education goals

One of the scores of the ASVAB is the military services' entrance score which may be used by your student to explore career options in the military. Your child's name and ASVAB CEP Scores will be released to the military unless you choose not to have their name released. Even if your child's name is released to the military, by no means is your child obligated to the military service.



Ski season will be here before we know it. Our club travels down to Holiday Valley each Tuesday after school beginning in January and ending in March. If good skiing conditions arrive in December, we may be able to get a night on the slopes in before our winter break. West Valley students in grades 7-12 are eligible, but I can accept students in 6th grade with parent/guardian permission and a phone call or meeting. If you would like to buy a pass through our club, please let me know and I can most likely provide you with the same prices as our club members. I am looking into that detail and will post additional information as it becomes available.

Skiing and boarding can get expensive during the winter months. Joining the club drastically reduces the overall cost of a student who participates in this outdoor sport. In addition to the cost savings, all members are provided free lessons on the nights that we go as a club. Another perk of the package is that students can ski/board any Tuesday evening that Holiday Valley is open even if the club does not go. Our club will travel by bus a total of 8 weeks from school.

Student season passes are available through the club at a discounted rate.

We will be having an informational meeting after school so that any interested students that are eligible can receive the necessary details and registration forms to join. Old Fort Niagara Field Trip



On Friday, October 5th 2018 Ms. Castro, Ms. Baren, Mr. Lembke, Mrs. Mazzuto, and Mrs. Mychajluk took the 4th, 7th and 8th grade students to Fall Frontier Days at Old Fort Niagara. Fall Frontier Days are a celebration of four nations that figured prominently in the early history of the Niagara Frontier. Students' experienced Native American, French, British and American history as it played out in a military community at the strategically important mouth of the Niagara River. The fort was divided into zones representing the different nations. Students used math skills to design an 18th century fort, heard about Native American wampum and diplomacy, learned about the French fur trade and explored the French Castle. They listened to fife and drum music of the period and learned about the importance of music to the army. Furthermore, there were demonstrations of the flintlock musket, students handled wooden muskets and learned the 1764 manual of arms used by British soldiers during the American Revolution, and a three pound cannon artillery demonstration.



Building a Model of Catal Huyuk

Students in 6th grade started the year by learning about world geography and the earliest known people. Part of their learning included understanding how the first civilization was created and what sustained the people of that community. Through the use of a variety of materials, students were tasked with creating a model of Catal Huyuk, the first known city in the world. Each group took a different approach to the design and focused on many different aspects of what they had learned. One group highlighted the importance of the nearby river, one group created a field of grains and barley, another featured crafts and jewelry that were created for trade, while others focused on the dwellings that people lived in by using ladders and rooftop entrances. Students had a great time using their creativity while also continuing their understanding of the earliest city. Nice work 6th graders!
