

# **ASVAB Career Exploration Program in December**

West Valley Central School will administer for free the ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) assessment instrument, which is part of the ASVAB Career Exploration Program (CEP), to any **interested** students in grades 10-12 on Thursday, December 6<sup>th</sup> from 8:00 AM to 11:00 AM. Please have your son/daughter sign up in the Guidance Office with Mr. LaBrake. This test is an invaluable tool to help your student with his/her future educational and career plans.

The ASVAB CEP will help your student:

- To learn more about themselves and the world of work
- Explore occupations in line with their interests and skills
- Develop an effective strategy to realize their career and education goals

One of the scores of the ASVAB is the military services' entrance score which may be used by your student to explore career options in the military. Your child's name and ASVAB CEP scores will be released to the military unless you choose not to have their name released. Even if your child's name is released to the military, by no means is your child obligated to the military service.

I put my stuff in the back seat of my car and I go back into the house and grab my bage! "LOVE YOU MOM" I yell. My voice cracked so I just grab my keys when I did I saw my fingertips were gold pure gold I got in my car and sped to school...

As I flop on the couch and snuggle in with my mom my feet get under her shirt on her warm stomach. I've grown without her miss her with all my heart but that can't bring back. A life without my mom is like I am a stray puppy I have help but I want help from my wonderful mommy. I know lots of people love me but I only want her love and all of her love. I wish I could bring her back...

At the age of eight, I was diagnosed with Tourette Syndrome, and since then, I've kept to myself in order to keep it under wraps. The less contact I have with others, the more I can control it. I don't speak up in class, I skip school on days I have to present a project, and I don't go out of my way to make friends...




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# **STEM in Kindergarten**

You may be asking yourself what is STEM? STEM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math. Kindergarteners have been completing STEM challenges throughout the first quarter of this year. STEM challenges require creativity and cooperation along with a whole lot of supplies and patience. We began the year creating a perch for Harry (a pink puff ball) so he can see more easily around our classroom.

Our next challenge involved apple rolling and stacking. We continued on to learning about the inside and outside of a pumpkin which led to an experiment with candy corn. In addition, we did an experiment with Skittles. Did you know that if you add warm water to Skittles that they will lose their color in a color path? Another fun challenge required us to create a monster trap.

Thank you to Mrs. Thiel for her help and great ideas and we look forward to many more challenges this year.













Once again, our elementary students had the opportunity to learn about an animal. This month Mr. Morton brought a turkey, named Norman, for us to learn about. We learned what a turkey eats, where it lives, how high and how fast it can fly and many other interesting facts about turkeys. Norman is around four years old, weighs about 40 pounds and is a permanent resident of the Sun Dance Kids Farm. The children had a great time learning all about him!





Buffalo Animal Adventures presented an Animal Adaptation Unit that taught our students about evolution and natural selection. The unit included a hands-on activity where students attempted to pick up seeds with certain utensils that were related to the beaks of birds. After the activity, the students learned about three specific animals who have unique adaptations to their ecosystems. The animals were the Von der Decken's hornbill, the Blue Tongue Skink, and the Crested Gecko.









# Welcome to the HeARTbeat of West Valley

Fall has been breezing by this school year and our artists have been very busy diving into their projects. Elementary students are learning a bit about Native American culture as the fourth graders are making shields and the 5<sup>th</sup> graders are working on totem poles. Our studio in art students have just finished their lesson on color theory and are now working on value. Drawing and painting students have taken on the challenge of creating self-portraits in an expres-
