






9th Grade Students on Track



For the purpose of this metric, core subjects include reading, math, science, and social studies. (ISBE, 2024)




Graduation Rate

Graduating cohorts are calculated based on the number of students who enter Grade 9 for the first time, adjusted by adding into the chorot any student who transfers in later during Grade 9 or during the next three years and subtracting and student from the cohort who transfers out for any valid reason. (ISBE 2024)

This data represents the percent of graduating students who enrolled in a community college or a four year university within 12 months of graduation.





This data represents the percent of students who enrolled in a community college and were required to take remedial classes in Math, Reading or Communication classes.




Percentage Community College Remedition Class of 2020



Students in grade 9, 10, and 11 take the *Growth: Math 6+* and *Growth: Reading 6+* test based on the 2010 Common Core State Standards.




MAP Cohort Data Class of 2025 Reading






MAP Cohort Data Class of 2025 Math








SAT Test Scores

The SAT served as Illinois' "required accountability assessment"¹ for public high schools from 2017 through 2024. Students were required to complete the SAT (or DLM) as a junior (or senior) to earn a standard high school diploma. Illinois students also had the opportunity to use their SAT scores as part of the college admissions process.

The April 2024 "school day" SAT was the first digital administration of the test, as well as the final year of the College Board's contract with the state. The digital ACT will be given to all Illinois juniors in the spring of 2025 as the new state accountability test.

AP Test Scores

Advanced Placement exams are standardized assessments designed to measure the content and skills in an AP course. The College Board designed the AP program to "enable willing and academically prepared students to pursue college-level studies—with the opportunity to earn college credit, advanced placement, or both—while still in high school."²

HB 3428 requires Illinois public colleges and universities to grant students who earn a 3, 4, or 5 on an AP test "credit to meet a corresponding course requirement for degree completion at that institution of higher education."³

EL Enrollment & ACCESS Testing

Students whose home language is not English are enrolled in bilingual, ESL, or Sheltered classes until they demonstrate English proficiency on the ACCESS test, which measures EL students' growth in reading, writing, speaking, and listening in English. "The purpose of ACCESS for ELLs is to monitor student progress in English language proficiency on a yearly basis."⁵

According to the Illinois Accountability Technical Advisory Committee (TAC), "Students in grades 9-12 demonstrate the lowest growth (often negative) regardless of starting level and regardless of whether they have been receiving services for less than 3 years or 3+ years."⁶
