CAVALIERS READY FOR PLAYOFFS WITH 51-8 DEMOLITION OF FAYETTE-WARE

When it's time for the postseason playoffs to begin, a coach wants his team to be hitting on all cylinders.

From what Coach Kevin Ward observed in the regular season finale, he believes his Crockett County Cavaliers are just about at that point.

Crockett's 51-8 rout of Fayette-Ware Halloween night featured standout performances in several areas as the Cavaliers improved their Region 7-4A record to 2-2 and their overall mark to 7-3. More importantly for Ward, his club didn't "play down to the competition." The Wildcats have just one win on the season, although Ward feels they are "much improved" over last year's squad.

"We played well tonight," Ward said. "We executed well. It would have been easy to let down after the loss to Haywood last week, but we didn't. And we could have been distracted because it was Senior Night. But we did everything we needed to do to get a good, solid win. There are always areas where we can improve, but this was a good showing heading into the playoffs."

And as Ward likes to say - and as he reminded his team Thursday night everyone starts the playoffs 0-0, "and anything can happen in high school football." The playoff road for Crockett begins Friday night in Memphis against Kirby High School, the number two seed from Region 8-4A. Kirby completed a 6-4 season by defeating Ridgeway 20-0. Fayette-Ware is the only common opponent on the Kirby and Crockett schedules; Kirby posted a 22-20 victory.

If the Cavs prevail in Memphis Friday, they would then face the winner of the Dyer County vs. Ridgeway game. Dyer County claimed the #1 seed from Region 7-4A by dominating Haywood 59-27 Thursday night, a margin virtually nobody expected. Haywood will now host Millington this week to begin the playoffs.

Ward was pleased not only with his Cavaliers' performance against Fayette-Ware but with the fact he was able to play several reserves and even reward a few seniors for their efforts. Laithon Bond caught his first pass of the season; lineman Travis Cork got to run the ball on a play in the fourth quarter; and Deuce Greenhill had a chance to handle his first kickoff return of the year – which he promptly carried 80 yards for a touchdown.

Crockett even threw a few new wrinkles into the offensive mix. DK Woods took a few snaps out of the Wildcat formation; Amarion Hobson gained a first down on a fake punt play; and holder Kris Phillips turned a fake 44-yard field goal try by Avery Hurst – who had just nailed a 37yarder seconds before – into a 27-yard touchdown pass to Dre Walker following a Gabe Dupree interception just before the end of the first half.

The Cavs – who totaled 410 offensive yards (509 if you count returns) – were in control from the opening kickoff. Crockett drove it 61 yards in eight plays, featuring a 24-yard run by Greenhill, and Woods provided the touchdown from 23 yards out. Hurst's extra made it 7-0 with less than four minutes gone.

The hosts promptly forced a Fayette-Ware punt and then marched 59 yards in nine snaps. Tight end Dre Walker posted the score on a 19-yard pass play from Ben Burgess, and Hurst's conversion boosted the margin to 14-0. On the Wildcats' very next play from scrimmage, Crockett's Ian Greenberg intercepted a Justin Price pass, giving the Cavs possession at the Fayette-Ware 38. Woods – who would finish the night with 196 yards on 13 carries – accounted for all the yards in the ensuing drive, finally scoring from seven yards out with 10:49 remaining in the half.

The visitors then constructed their first threat of the contest, using runs of 32 yards by Braylon Walker and 23 yards by Reynaldeus Raimey to get the ball all the way down to the Cav two. Crockett's defense stiffened, however, stacking a runner up on two plays and deflecting passes on two more to regain possession at the Wildcat three.

From there, sophomore Woods took a handoff, knifed to his left, and thundered 97 yards for the longest run of his career as the Cavs went up 28-0 with 7:23 still to play in the second quarter.

After forcing another punt, Crockett's crew marched 56 yards to another score, keyed by Hobson's eight-yard gain on a fourth-down run from the punt position and a 22-yard scamper by Greenhill. The Cavs reached the Wildcat 20 before three straight pass attempts fell incomplete, bringing Hurst on for his 37-yard field goal. Crockett led 31-0 with only 19 seconds left in the half.

After the ensuing kickoff return and a Wildcat holding penalty, Dupree leaped in front of another Price pass and picked it off at the 27 with mere seconds remaining. The Cavs rushed Hurst onto the field to line up a 44-yard kick attempt, but as he strode toward the ball, Phillips jumped up from his holding position and calmly tossed a touchdown pass covering 27 yards to a wide-open Walker, who crossed the goal line with no time showing on the clock, giving the Cavs a 37-0 halftime advantage.

At that point, the teams agreed to play the second half as two 10-minute quarters with a running clock. The Wildcats then put together four plays of double-digit gains in driving 65 yards for a touchdown, which Raimey scored from five yards out. A two point conversion pass from Price to 6-6 receiver Tarecous Stevens cut the Crockett margin to 37-8. Fayette-Ware's joy was short-lived. Greenhill, whose offensive touches had been limited in recent games, lined up as the deep back on the kickoff for the first time this year, fielded a high boot at his own 20, zigged once to leave a defender in a twisted heap, and turned on the jets to cover the 80 yards in a flash. Hurst's extra made it 44-8 with 4:49 left in the third period.

Crockett forced another Fayette-Ware punt when Jake Knox nailed Raimey for a three-yard loss on a third-down run, and the Cavs took over at their own 31. Lineman Cork gained a yard on his senior reward carry before Demo Pickens broke a 26-yard burst. From that point, Crockett turned the ball-carrying duties over to freshman Khalan Thomas, who eventually tallied on a 22-yard scamper at the 3:13 mark of the fourth, running behind a line of fired-up reserves.

Now it's playoff time.

"Every team is 0-0 now," Ward reiterated. "We all start from the same spot. Our success will depend on how well we prepare. So each player needs to build that mindset now."




