It is essential that families check Aeries to see students' grades. See more about how to login, how to set up notifications and the Aeries app here.</p>
<p>Google Classroom</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Many teachers at Sobrato use Google Classroom to share information and post assignments. • Families can receive email summaries about their student's activity in Google Classroom. • Check Aeries, not Google Classroom, for grades. • To sign up for Google Classroom email summaries, families must accept an email invitation from a teacher or administrator. <p>Grades</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students and families can check grades in Aeries. • It is recommended that students meet with their teacher in tutorial if they have C- or lower in any course. • Semester grades are the grades that determine whether or not a student gets credit toward graduation. Student Supports

Library

Students can check out books, print, get help with their chromebook, and have a quiet study space in the library during brunch, lunch, and 15 minutes after school.

Tutorial

Tutorial is a 30-minute class four days a week when students attend extra time with any of their assigned teachers. Students can make up exams, turn in missing work, and get additional help during this time.

Homework Help

- The library is open after school Monday-Thursday until 4:45pm for students to have a quiet place to work.
- Students can contact their counselors if they would like to find a peer tutor in a specific subject.

Extracurriculars - Sports, Clubs, Theater, and Band

- There are sports after school, clubs during lunch or after school, theater performances, FFA, and band performances.
- In order to be eligible for sports, students must have a 2.0 at each quarter (October and March) and semester (December and June).

Transportation

MoGo

MoGo Morgan Hill Quick Ride is Morgan Hill's on-demand rideshare service. MoGo offers trips to and from fixed points citywide, within a 10-minute walk to all neighborhoods and stops at downtown, shopping centers, schools, recreation facilities, businesses, and community spaces, including Sobrato High School. The service is for short trips and uses small vehicles (seating up to 5 customers). Cost for students is \$1 per ride. Book a ride at book.mogo.rideco.com or download the MoGo app.

<p style="text-align: center;">Meals: Brunch and Lunch</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Brunch and lunch are free for all students on campus. • Students can go to the lunch line, type in their student ID, and receive food. • Click below for the monthly menus: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◦ Brunch Menu ◦ Lunch Menu 	<p style="text-align: center;">Dropping Off Items</p> <p>Visitors and any items being dropped off to students must be brought through the front office, not through the gate. Only school-related items may be dropped off.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Attendance & Arriving to Campus</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Nearly 90% of freshmen who are absent less than 1 week of school per semester GRADUATE FROM HIGH SCHOOL regardless of their 8th grade test scores. • Students are expected to maintain a 90% positive attendance rate in order to participate in sports, clubs, or after-school activities like dances. This means students can miss approximately 18 school days during the whole year. • If students arrive late to the beginning of school, they must check in through the front office. • Click here for our full attendance policy. 	<p style="text-align: center;">Minga</p> <p>Sobrato High School has implemented the Minga app. This app will be used by students, teachers, campus monitors, and attendance clerks to monitor student hall passes. When students need to show their school ID, they use the Minga app to do so. Students can also access Minga on their school-issued Chromebook.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Cell Phone Policy</p> <p>Students cannot bring their phones to PE or the bathroom. In class, students will put their phones in a cell phone caddy in the classroom and will not use their phone unless allowed by the teacher. If families want to contact their student, they can call the front office or text/email their student with the understanding that the student will receive the message after class is over. Click here for the full cell phones and devices policy.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Plagiarism</p> <p>When students submit work that they did not think of themselves it is considered plagiarism, which is cheating. While it is okay to use translation apps to check your work, students are expected to write their work themselves, not “copy/paste” work from other sources, like books or the internet. Students may not use AI to write work for them. Plagiarizing is not accepted in schools or colleges and could result in a failing grade or other consequences.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Finals</p> <p>Final exams occur at the end of each semester and can have a significant impact on students’ grades because they assess student learning from the whole semester. Finals are Dec 16-19, 2024 and June 3-6, 2025. Academics and Wellness

Graduation & College Pathways, A-G Eligibility

- To graduate from high school, students need to earn a grade of D or better in all of their classes. This makes them eligible to apply to a community college (2-year college)
- To be eligible to apply to a University (4-year college), students need to earn grades of Cs or better in all of their classes. We call this “A-G eligible.”

CTE and VAPA Electives

- Students are required to take at least one Career Tech Education (CTE) class and one Visual and Performing Arts (VAPA) class.
- If a student takes two classes in the same CTE or VAPA pathway, they earn a “pathway completer” cord upon graduation.

AP Courses & Dual Enrollment

Sobrato High School offers Advanced Placement (AP) Courses and Dual Enrollment Classes, which provide students with the opportunity to earn college credit.

- AP Courses and Dual Enrollment Courses are college-level courses, taught by Sobrato staff
- AP and Dual Enrollment Courses give students a GPA boost (if students earn a B, it counts as an A)
- AP and Dual Enrollment courses allow students to challenge themselves and learn critical academic and organizational skills to help them in college or careers
- Students in AP courses are expected to take the AP exam in May. This is how they earn college credit. Financial aid is available.

When to go to the Counseling Office

Students and their families can contact the counseling office for the following reasons:

- Mistakes on or questions about class schedules
- Questions about graduation or college eligibility
- Help with scholarships or colleges
- Jobs/work permits
- Help with getting accommodations for learning disabilities

Wellness Center

Students can go to the Wellness Center for the following:

- Need time to refocus or experiencing anxiety or depression during class time
- Want a place to relax during brunch, lunch, or before/after school
- Want to connect with a therapist or counselor
- Want a place to do craft projects or a place with alternate seating options
