SCHOOL PROFILE 2024-2025

The American School of Tangier (AST) is an independent, coeducational day school, located in Tangier, Morocco. The school was founded in 1950 and has a rich history intertwined with the growth of our historic city. We offer a rigorous educational program from pre-kindergarten through grade 12 for students of all nationalities. The school year consists of two 18-week semesters extending from September to the mid-January, and from the end of January to June.

ENROLLMENT

In the 2024-2025 school year, enrollment is 505 (PK-grade 12). Our students include 49 U.S. citizens, 232 host-country nationals, and 224 third-country nationals from 43 countries.

FACULTY

Across the school we have 46 faculty.

This year's faculty include 23 international teachers who are citizens of US, Canada, UK, Australia, Sri Lanka, Kenya, India, Romania or Mauritius, as well as, 23 host-country nationals.

GRADES 9 TO 12 COURSE OFFERINGS

AP Capstone Program: AP Seminar and AP Research.

English: Pre-AP English 1 and Pre-AP English 2, 11th and 12th grade courses and AP English Language and Composition.

Social Sciences: International Relations and Middle East history (one class), 20th Century History, World History, Sociology, AP Human Geography, and AP Psychology, Modern and Political Philosophy.

World Languages: Arabic, French, and AP French Language and Culture.

Math: Pre-AP Geometry with Statistics, Pre-AP Algebra 2, Pre-Calculus, AP Pre-Calculus, AP Calculus AB, and AP Statistics.

Science: Pre-AP Biology, Environmental Science, Physics, Pre-AP Chemistry, AP Physics 1, AP Biology, and AP Chemistry.

Computer Science: Computer programming (Java and Python), and AP Computer Science.

Electives may include: Pre-AP Visual Art, AP Art Drawing, Physical Education, Public Speaking, and/or online courses via Edgenuity.

Note: Starting in the 23-24 school year AST began to consistently offer the AP courses noted above in order to help support student learning and create a consistent learning pathway in all our subject areas.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

THE GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS FOR AN AST HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA INCLUDE BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO:

- » 4 credits in English
- » 4 credits in History
- » 4 credits in Math
- » 4 credits in Science
- » 4 credits in Arabic (if Moroccan)
- » 4 credits of a World Language (if non-Moroccan)
- » 6 credits of Electives
- » 2 credits in Physical Education
- » 120 hours of community service, evenly divided between in-school and out-of-school activities.

High school courses resumed full time in-person learning during the second semester. In the 2021-2022 school year, AST courses were on-campus with limited extracurricular activities occurring during the second semester. In the 2022-2023 school year, AST resumed all extracurricular activities for students.
