Pam Brittenburg reports: ELPAC testing is underway, the middle schools are finished. The other sites are underway besides Grant, Washington and Zoe Barnum who will start soon. The District recently met with our ELD curriculum partners: E.L. Achieve. They will be coming to visit on April 19, 2023, visiting sites and giving ECS feedback. Afterwards ECS hopes to implement the recommendations that fit well with our program model. Pam will be certified in June as an E.L. Achieve coordinator for the district. PIQE update: 28 families are graduating tonight at the high school level program, next week 25 graduate at the middle school program for SEL, and 33 families just started the elementary level program last thursday. AB- field trip for 4th and 5th grade students to the Arcata Playhouse. May 4th and 5th is the Alice Birney multicultural fair. The ECS EL team went down to San Francisco to attend the E.L. Achieve Symposium.
