

Importantly, almost all sessions feature presentations from our own staff and/or students. Our elementary staff members met at Normandy High School where they began the day with a panel discussion entitled, "Supporting our Students' Emotional and Behavioral Needs," featuring mental health professionals from local agencies. Later, teachers had a wide array of sessions from which to choose, including "Best Practices for Teaching English Learners," "Engaging Early Learners with Technology," "Supporting Students' Academic Needs with Online Tutoring and Test Prep", and "Curriculum to Reach Extended Standards." ## The Parma City School District Joins Innovative GEAR UP Program to Boost College Readiness



The Parma City School District (PCSD) is proud to announce its participation in a groundbreaking educational initiative aimed at preparing our students for success in higher education. As part of the First Ring Schools Collaborative, our district has been selected to benefit from a \$3.8 million per year GEAR UP (Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs) grant awarded by the U.S. Department of Education to the Educational Service Center (ESC) of Northeast Ohio.

This seven-year program, running through 2031, will provide comprehensive support to our middle and high school students, setting them on a path to postsecondary education success. PCSD joins nine other districts in this transformative project, including Brooklyn, Cleveland Heights-University Heights, East Cleveland, Euclid, Garfield Heights, Maple Heights, Richmond Heights, South Euclid-Lyndhurst, and Warrensville Heights City Schools.

Key highlights of the program include:

1. Early Intervention: The program will start with the district's current 6th and 7th- grade students, following them through high school graduation.

2. Support & Engagement: Students can receive a combination of academic and career advising, college exploration opportunities, and test preparation, through programming that may be offered during the school day, after school, and during the summer months.

3. Expert Guidance: College Now Greater Cleveland will provide experienced college and career advisors to work directly with the district's students.

4. Postsecondary Focus: The program aims to increase the number of students prepared for, enrolling in, and graduating from college.

5. Partnerships: Collaborations with Cuyahoga Community College, Cleveland State University, the Greater Cleveland Career Consortium, and the Higher Education Compact will enhance the program's effectiveness.

Dr. Michele Scott Taylor, College Now president and incoming CEO, emphasized the program's importance: "This opportunity allows us to reach more students and families earlier, starting with middle school students, so that by the time they begin high school, a college-going mindset will already be deeply rooted in them."

The GEAR UP program addresses a critical need in this region. With only 51% of Ohio's population currently meeting the credentials required for 65% of jobs in the state, this initiative will play a crucial role in preparing our students for future success and contributing to the economic growth of Northeast Ohio.

PCSD is excited to embark on this journey with our students and families. We believe this program will open doors of opportunity and empower our young learners to reach their full potential!

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
