





Membership in the National Honor Society is one of the highest honors that can be awarded to a high school student. Each of the four high schools in the Lenape Regional High School District has a chapter of the National Honor Society.

Membership is based on the student's outstanding achievement in scholarship, service, leadership, and character. The student must be a member of the school community at least one semester prior to applying.

Criteria

Advisors

All of the following criteria must be met in order to be considered for admission:

Scholarship - A student must be a junior or senior who has a regular cumulative unweighted grade point average of 3.25 or higher or a weighted grade point average of 4.875.

Service - A student must demonstrate commitment to a minimum of 3 activities within his/her school and community service totaling 20 hours per year. Service activities are those which benefit others and for which students receive no form of compensation.

Leadership - A student must demonstrate leadership qualities in and out of the classroom.

Character - A student must demonstrate the "six pillars of character": respect, responsibility, trustworthiness, fairness, caring, and citizenship.
