





High School - Average Daily Attendance




STEAM ACADEMY - Average Daily Attendance






New Jersey Graduation Proficiency Assessment Mathematics










New Jersey Graduation Proficiency Assessment The Importance of Knowing Each Child





19 students "on the bubble" as they are within 10 points of the cut off score (1-3 questions)






