

School led: SSC

School Site Council

The School Site Council is the school's governing Committee that determines the best use of allocated state LCFF funds and Title 1 federal funds in order to provide the best outcome for all the students.

Functions:

- •Develop a comprehensive single plan for student achievement based on student data.
- •Ensure that the school is identifying curriculum and instructional practices that are research based and proven to be successful.
- •Allocation of supplemental funds to improve student achievement.

- Allocation of funds based on the needs of students.
- •Recommend the school plan for student achievement to the local school board.
- •Review meeting and operational procedures.
- •Review bylaws and develop an annual meeting calendar.
- Develop the school safety plan.

School led: SBDM

Site Based Decision Making

Purpose:

To ensure that staff, parents, and students at individual school sites have a vehicle for engaging in the decision-making that most affected their own sites.

Together they exchange ideas, data, and other information necessary for improving educational opportunities for HUSD students.

(ex: School start/ end times, # of noon supervisors, student lunch schedules, etc.)

How they are different:

•PTA - Parent Teacher Association

oA local parent membership group formally affiliated with California and National PTA.

•PTO - Parent Teacher Organization

oAn independent parent group

•PTSA - Parent Teacher Student Association

•A local parent and student membership group formally affiliated with California and National PTA at the High School level.

Purpose of PTA/PTO/PTSA

- •Fundraise for field trips, classroom supplies, assemblies, etc.
- •Host programs and events: Movie Night, Festivals, Holiday events, Book Fairs, etc.
- •Advocate for students and families

School Led: AASAI

The <u>African American Student Achievement Initiative</u> (AASAI) is a Hayward Unified School District (HUSD) initiative that focuses on bringing about equitable, systemic, and transformative change in teaching and learning to more effectively address the academic, social and emotional needs of its African American (AA) students, families and communities that nurture and support them.

AASAI's 4 priority areas are as follows:

1.Closing the Achievement Gap2.Cultural and Linguistic Responsive Pedagogy3.School Climate

4. Family Engagement

Each school site is required to have at least 2 AASAI meetings for the school year.

School led: ELAC

ENGLISH LEARNERS ADVISORY COMMITTEE (ELAC)

The **purpose** of the English Learners Advisory Committee is to <u>advise</u> the principal and school staff on the needs, programs and services for English Learners and on the development of the School Plan (SPSA) and budget as it pertains to English Learners.

Each California public school, grades kindergarten through 12, with 21 or more English Learners must form an ELAC
Responsible for advising the principal on programs and services for English Learners
Responsible for advising the SSC committee on the development of the Single Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA).
Parents or guardians of English learners must have an opportunity to elect the parent members to serve on the ELAC and have the opportunity to elect at least one member to the District English Learners Advisory Committee (DELAC).
The district must provide appropriate training to assist each member carry his or her legally advisory responsibilities.
It must follow the GREEN ACT (SB 355):

1. Must be open to the public

2. Must allow the public to speak on any matter on the agenda for that particular meeting

3. Must be announced at least 72 hrs in advance (specific date, time, location, and agenda)

4. Make any meeting materials available to the public upon request





District Led: DELAC

The purpose of the HUSD District English Learners Advisory Committee (DELAC) is to serve as a forum for parents of English Learners to advise District leadership and provide recommendations to the HUSD Board of Trustees on decisions concerning programs, services, and policies for English Learners and their families.

Each district with 51 or more English learners, regardless of language, must form a functioning district English learner advisory committee (DELAC) or a subcommittee of an existing district wide advisory committee.

The committee advises (reviews and comments) the district governing board on at least the following:

1. A timetable for implementation or revision of the district's master plan of education programs and services for English learners, taking into consideration the school site master plans.

2. Conducting a district-wide needs assessment on a school-by-school basis.

3. Establishment of district program, goals, and objectives for programs and services for English learners.


4. Development of a plan to ensure compliance with any applicable teacher and/or teacher aide requirements.

5. Explanation of the annual language census to parents (e.g. procedures and forms)

6. Review and comment on district reclassification procedures.

7. Review and comment on the written notifications required to be sent to parents and guardians pursuant to Education Code Section 48985 and Title 5, CCR, Subchapter 4, Section 11316.

The APICI also aims to strengthen AANHPI family and community engagement and unity, and create a safe, supportive school environment that understands, respects, and advocates for the academic and social-emotional needs of all AANHPI students and families.

Local Control Curriculum:

Functions of local control curriculum.

Review and approve all curriculum and program requirements.
Review of school courses and make decisions based on their outcomes
Reviews contain the following focal points:
Do they satisfy the school requirements?
Is there a lack of qualified teachers to teach the course?
Do they have a low turnout in the course?
Was there a change in the course requirements?
Is there lack of funding?

<u>Safety Committee:</u> May be an independent committee on campus or the responsibilities may be adopted by the School Site Council.

The Safety committee must follow a guideline that contain 2 different parts:

1.Complete an assessment of the school

2. Review and evaluate the annual school comprehensive safety plan created by the District.

Annual School Comprehensive Safety Plan topics:

a.Child abuse reporting

b.Policies regarding suspension, expulsion, and mandatory expulsion

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c.Communication procedures for teachers regarding a

dangerous student on campus

d.Sexual harassment

e.School traffic/ Safety entering and exiting schools f.Dress codes
