During this past week the Cowboy TV lessons focused on being flexible, which is the ability to adapt to change and deal with problems. Anytime children are asked to change what they're doing, they're being asked to demonstrate flexibility. In addition, cognitive flexibility is a skill that helps students demonstrate expected behavior both at school and outside of school. Cognitive flexibility includes handling transitions by shifting easily from one task to another; handling deviation from rules, routines, and original plans; and handling unpredictability, ambiguity, uncertainty, and novelty. Parents can help their children develop their flexibility skills by praising them when they exhibit flexibility and by encouraging their children to think about things in different ways and from a variety of perspectives.
