RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that the Board approve the acceptance of the IDOE Paraprofessional Grant for the 2024-25 school year in the amount of \$20,000.

RELATED INFORMATION: This grant will provide training to Fort Wayne Community Schools Paraprofessionals. Topics include autism, student behavior plans, accommodations and modifications. Dr. Nikki Sprunger, Assistant Superintendent of Diverse Learners, was available to answer questions.

A motion was made by Julie Hollingsworth, seconded by Anne Duff, that the recommendation concerning the Paraprofessional Training Grant 2024-25 be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Student Lenovo Chromebooks for Towles Intermediate and Towles New Tech Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Student Lenovo Chromebooks for Towles Intermediate and Towles New Tech:

RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that the Board approve the purchase of Lenovo Chromebooks from Trafera of Saint Paul, MN for \$263,835.

RELATED INFORMATION: The purchase of 615 Lenovo 300e G4 Chromebooks will allow us to expand our use of Chromebooks at Towles Intermediate and expand our middle school pilot at Towles New Tech. These Chromebooks will also come with four years of Accidental Damage Protection. FWCS was able to secure pricing from Trafera that is 30% below the Omnia Partners contract price. Indiana law does not require public bidding for purchases made at or below approved corporative purchasing agencies and/or GSA pricing.

Funding will come from the Common School Fund (CSF) loan and the 2024 Technology General Obligation Bond.

Jack Byrd, Chief Systems Officer, was available to answer questions.

A motion was made by Julie Hollingsworth, seconded by Jennifer Matthias, that the recommendation concerning the Student Lenovo Chromebooks for Towles Intermediate and Towles New Tech be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Early Learning Center Memorandum of Understanding with EACS Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Early Learning Center Memorandum of Understanding with EACS:

RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that the Board approve a Memorandum of Understanding with East Allen County Schools for the creation and operation of an early learning center.

RELATED INFORMATION: The four key intended outcomes for the project are to:

- Keep parenting high school students in school and helping them graduate with a plan and a purpose.
- Provide the very best of care and education to over 115 children in lower income neighborhoods.
- Boost economic development by creating an additional pool of educated, certified, high-quality early learning workers, up to 60 students annually.
- Strengthen a neighborhood in transition by creating a community anchor that provides a sense of place, an aura of vitality, and a focal point of beauty for generations to come.

Mitch Sheppard, Director of Philanthropy was available to answer questions.

A motion was made by Jennifer Matthias, seconded by Noah Smith, that the recommendation concerning the Early Learning Center Memorandum of Understanding with EACS be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Temporary Inter-fund Loan Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Temporary Inter-fund Loan:

RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that the Board approve all inter-fund loans necessary to eliminate deficits in certain funds of the corporation as of June 30, 2024.

RELATED INFORMATION: Cash deficits in funds of the corporation are not allowed at the end of a fiscal year. Deficits in property tax supported funds could occur if the distribution of property taxes from Allen County is short of expectations. Normal timing differences between revenue and expenditures could cause temporary deficits. State statute allows temporary transfers between funds if

certain requirements are met. The treasurer will make all necessary transfers and report the loans to the Board.

Rosemary Shipman, Chief Financial Officer, was available to answer questions.

A motion was made by Anne Duff, seconded by Noah Smith, that the recommendation concerning the Temporary Inter-fund Loan be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Transfer from the Education Fund to the Operations Fund Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Transfer from the Education Fund to the Operations Fund:

RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that the Board approve a transfer of up to \$10,000,000 from the Education Fund to the Operations Fund. This represents 4.2% of budgeted Education fund revenue.

RELATED INFORMATION: Beginning in 2019, Indiana school districts deposit State tuition support to the Education Fund and property taxes to the Operations Fund. Transfers from the Education Fund to the Operations Fund are necessary to properly fund expenditures necessary to the operations of the school district. Half will be transferred by June 30 and the balance needed by December 31.

Rosemary Shipman, Chief Financial Officer, was available to answer questions.

RESOLUTION TO TRANSFER AMOUNTS FROM EDUCATION FUND TO THE OPERATIONS FUND

WHEREAS, the Board of School Trustees is the governing body of Fort Wayne Community Schools, Allen County, Indiana, and

WHEREAS, HEA 1009 required the governing body of each school corporation to establish an Education Fund for the payment of expenses allocated to student instruction and learning under IC 20-42.5, and

WHEREAS, HEA 1009 required the governing body of each school corporation to establish an Operations Fund for the payment of expenses that are not allocated to student instruction and learning under IC 20-42.5, and

WHEREAS, HEA 1009 requires that distributions of tuition support be received in the Education Fund.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of School Trustees authorizes the Treasurer of Fort Wayne Community Schools to transfer the amount of up to \$10,000,000 from the Education Fund to the Operations Fund to reimburse the Operations Fund for expenses that are not allocated to student instruction and learning under IC 20-42.5 for the period of 2024.

A motion was made by Anne Duff, seconded by Noah Smith, that the recommendation concerning the Transfer from the Education Fund to the Operations Fund be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Resolution Authorizing the Issuance of Refunding Bonds:

RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that the Board approve a resolution that authorizes the future refunding of certain bonds if interest savings will be at least 2%.

RELATED INFORMATION: The Fort Wayne Community Schools Building Corporation issued bonds in 2015 and 2016 related to the 2012 referendum. Outstanding payments of these bonds are

Resolution Authorizing the Issuance of Refunding Bonds eligible for refunding (refinancing). he resolution allows for all or a portion of the outstanding bonds to be refunded.

The Fort Wayne Community Schools Building Corporation took appropriate action prior to this meeting that allows for refunding bonds upon Board approval.

A motion was made by Noah Smith, seconded by Steve Corona, that the recommendation concerning the Resolution Authorizing the Issuance of Refunding Bonds be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Possible 2024-2025 District-Wide Equipment and Facility Improvement Project Financing:

Possible 2024-2025 District-Wide Equipment and Facility Improvement Project Financing

RECOMMENDATION: The Board conducted a public hearing regarding the financing of a possible 2024-2025 District-Wide Equipment and Facility Improvement Project (the "Project") with general obligation bonds and/or building corporation property tax first mortgage bonds. Notice of the Public Hearing was published in the Journal Gazette on May 31, 2024.

RELATED INFORMATION: The maximum principal amount of bonds to be issued to finance the Project will be no more than Fifty-Five Million Six Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$55,650,000). The Project will include, but not be limited to, all or any portion of certain upgrades, updates, improvements, and renovations throughout the FWCS District, including (a) improvements to all or any portion of certain outdoor physical education/extra-curricular/co-curricular facilities, including all or any portion of the Snider and North Side athletic facilities and the Helen P Brown Natatorium at South Side High School, (b) renovations of the Grile Administration Center and the Wendy Y. Robinson Family and Community Engagement Center, including, but not limited to, restrooms, conference areas and offices, (c) the acquisition and installation of a new district-wide time clock system, (d) the replacement and/or installation of new heating and air condition systems and related equipment, (e) certain projects at the Amp Lab at Electric Works, (f) acquisition of equipment to be used in FWCS's co-curricular and/or extra-curricular activities, and (g) miscellaneous facility improvement and/or equipping projects at one or more facilities operated by FWCS.

Rosie Shipman, Chief Financial Officer, made a presentation regarding the project. Upon conclusion of the presentation, all interested parties were entitled and encouraged to present their testimony and ask questions regarding the project or bonds.

The hearing was held and there were no comments from the public.

Rosie Shipman, Chief Financial Officer; Darren Hess, Director of Facilities; Riley Johnson, Director, Amp Lab at Electric Works; Jeff Qualkinbush, Barnes and Thornburg LLC and Jim Elizondo, Stifel Public Finance were available to answer questions.

Comments

Board Member Steve Corona asked fellow Board members about getting a replacement for Rohli on the Fort Wayne Redevelopment Commission. Mr. Corona thanked the staff for their attention to detail with FWCS graduations. We know how to do it so that it is organized and well done.

Board Member Julie Hollingsworth also acknowledged the tremendous job well done at graduation. She attended Wayne's event. Member Hollingsworth spoke about the 2023-24 Indiana School Choice report that was recently released. Some of the data she spoke about was that there has been a student increase of 32%, hit over 70,000 students, cost jumped 40%, family of four making \$222,000 are now eligible for a voucher. Private enrollment only increased 5%, now subsidizing current nonpub enrolled students. Is this really good public policy? How is this helping? The program was originally supposed to be for low-income students, now middle- and high-income students.

Board Member Jennifer Matthias also commented on Indiana School Choice that the community needs to see what the vouchers are doing and be informed. Need to have strong community with economic

growth, encourage to ask more questions. Member Matthias was also able to attend graduations. She spoke about the Virtual Academy and how proud she is of them and other graduates who made it to the end.

Board Member Anne Duff congratulated Steve Corona for recently receiving the GFW public service award. Member Duff enjoyed the Lakeside 8th grade graduation. Ms. Duff also spoke about the end-of-year Lunch Buddy event and upcoming family summer event.

Board Member Noah Smith also commented on how impressive our graduations are and talked about it being one of the best parts of being on the Board. Member Smith also congratulated Mr. Corona on the GFW award, along with GFW's John Urbahn receiving the Sagamore of the Wabash.

Superintendent Dr. Mark Daniel reminded the public of Levan Scott's Open House later this week along with Bridge of Grace. He is pleased with this public and private relationship. The Superintendent said that it has been a phenomenal school year. Reminded the public that we need bus drivers. Would like to see teams of staff from schools share driving a route from school assistants to teachers, this would be another source of income. Dr. Daniel ended by thanking the staff for an amazing year.

Board President Maria Norman was unable to attend graduations due to her mother's 60th birthday celebration. The District 4 interviews are open to the public and will be held Tuesday, June 11 and Wednesday, June 12, with a Special Meeting to vote on the replacement on June 17, with the swearing in on June 24.

Next Meeting A special meeting of the Board is scheduled for Monday, June 17, 2024, at 6:00 p.m. in the Lester L. Grile Administrative Center.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF THE FORT WAYNE COMMUNITY SCHOOLS BUILDING CORPORATION UNLIMITED AD VALOREM PROPERTY TAX FIRST MORTGAGE REFUNDING BONDS, SERIES 2024 (OR SUCH OTHER DESIGNATION), APPROVING CERTAIN DOCUMENTS RELATED THERETO AND APPROVING OTHER MATTERS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH

WHEREAS, the Fort Wayne Community Schools Building Corporation, as lessor (the "Building Corporation"), was established on March 21, 2003, as an Indiana nonprofit corporation operating pursuant to the provisions of the Indiana Nonprofit Act of 1991, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Building Corporation previously issued its Unlimited Ad Valorem Property Tax First Mortgage Bonds, Series 2015 (the "2015 Bonds"), in the original aggregate principal amount of Eight Million Seven Hundred Forty Thousand Dollars (\$8,740,000), pursuant to a Second Supplemental Trust Indenture, dated as of December 1, 2015 (the "Second Supplemental Indenture"), supplementing a Trust Indenture, dated as of June 1, 2013 (the "Original Indenture"), as supplemented and amended by the First Supplemental Indenture, dated as of May 15, 2014 (the "First Supplemental Indenture"), each of which is made and entered into between the Building Corporation and The Huntington National Bank (successor to The Bank of New York Mellon Trust Company, N.A. by assignment), as trustee (the "Trustee"), the proceeds of which were used to pay for the cost of acquiring the existing Abbett Elementary School, the respective related outdoor facilities and the real estate on which all such improvements are located, which are operated by the Fort Wayne Community Schools, Allen County, Indiana (the "School Corporation"), and to pay the costs of issuing the 2015 Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Building Corporation previously issued its Unlimited Ad Valorem Property Tax First Mortgage Bonds, Series 2016 (the "2016 Bonds"), in the original aggregate principal amount of One Million Eight Hundred Sixty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$1,865,000), pursuant to a Third Supplemental Trust Indenture, dated as of December 1, 2015 (the "Third Supplemental Indenture"), by and between the Building Corporation and the Trustee, supplementing the Original Indenture, as supplemented and amended by the First Supplemental Indenture and the Second Supplemental Indenture, the proceeds of which were used to reimburse the School Corporation for that portion of the 2013 Building Corporation Project or the 2014 Building Corporation Project (each as defined in the Third Supplemental Indenture) funded by the School Corporation and not previously reimbursed by the Building Corporation and to pay the costs of issuing the 2016 Bonds; and

WHEREAS, in connection with the issuance of the 2015 Bonds, the Building Corporation and the School Corporation, as lessee, previously entered into a Master Lease, dated as of April 29, 2013 (the "Original Master Lease"), as amended by an Addendum to Master Lease, dated as of June 1, 2013 (the "First Addendum to Master Lease"), a Second Addendum to Master Lease, dated as of May 15, 2014 (the "Second Addendum to Master Lease"), and a Third Addendum to Master Lease, dated as of December 1, 2015 (the "Third Addendum to Master Lease"); and

WHEREAS, in connection with the issuance of the 2016 Bonds, the Building Corporation and the School Corporation, as lessee, previously entered into the Original Master

Lease, as amended by the First Addendum to Master Lease, the Second Addendum to Master Lease, the Third Addendum to Master Lease and a Fourth Addendum to Master Lease, dated as of December 1, 2015 (the "Fourth Addendum to Master Lease"); and

WHEREAS, Indiana Code 5-1-5, as amended (the "Act"), authorizes the refunding of obligations prior to the time such obligations are subject to redemption, in order to affect a savings; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Act, the Board of School Trustees of the School Corporation (the "Board") desires (a) to provide for the issuance of bonds of the Building Corporation in one or more series, in an original aggregate principal amount not to exceed Seven Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$7,500,000) (the "2024 Refunding Bonds") to current refund (i) all or any portion of the 2015 Bonds which are outstanding as of the date hereof in the aggregate principal amount of Four Million Eight Hundred Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$4,890,000) and mature or are subject to mandatory sinking fund redemption on July 15, 2025, through and including July 15, 2032 (the "Refunded 2015 Bonds"), and (ii) all or a portion of the 2016 Bonds which are outstanding as of the date hereof in the aggregate principal amount of One Million Eight Hundred Sixty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$1,865,000) (the "Refunded 2016 Bonds"), to effect a savings to the Building Corporation and the School Corporation, and (b) to the extent permitted by law, to take all of the necessary steps to enter into an amendment to the Original Master Lease, as amended through the date hereof (the "Fifth Amendment to Master Lease") with the Building Corporation, pursuant to which the Building Corporation and the School Corporation will finance the refunding of the Refunded 2015 Bonds and the Refunded 2016 Bonds; and

WHEREAS, Section 15 of the Act provides that, in connection with the issuance of refunding bonds, an issuing body and the lessee of any building, financed with the proceeds or obligations being refunded may enter into an amendment modifying or amending the provisions of such lease in one or more of the following respects: (i) to provide for a reduction in the amount of lease rental payable by the lessee; (ii) to provide for extensions or reductions of the time set forth in the lease before the option of the lessee to purchase may be exercised to such times as may be agreed upon by the issuing body and the lessee; or (iii) to provide that the lease rental payable by the lessee or lessees after redemption of the bonds being refunded may be payable to the trustee under a trust indenture securing such refunding bonds; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 15 of the Act, the Board now desires (i) to enter into the Fifth Amendment to Master Lease with the Building Corporation for the purpose of modifying or amending the provisions of the Original Master Lease, as amended through the date hereof (the "Master Lease"), in one or more of the following respects: (a) to provide for a reduction in the amount of lease rental payable by the School Corporation; (b) to provide for extensions or reductions of the time set forth in the Master Lease before the option of the School Corporation to purchase may be exercised to such times as may be agreed upon by the Building Corporation and the School Corporation, or (c) to provide that the lease rental payable by the lessee or lessees after redemption of the bonds being refunded may be payable to the trustee under a trust indenture securing such refunding bonds, and (ii) authorize certain actions in connection therewith; and

general counsel for the 2024 Refunding Bonds, and such other people or entities as any of the foregoing may determine is necessary or desirable to develop the necessary documentation to implement the advance or current refunding of the Refunded Bonds. The Superintendent or Chief Financial Officer is authorized to execute agreements and/or engagement letters with Stifel, Nicolaus & Company, Incorporated, as the underwriter of the 2024 Refunding Bonds, and with Barnes & Thornburg LLP, as the bond counsel and general counsel of the 2024 Refunding Bonds, with such terms and conditions as the Superintendent or the Chief Financial Officer deem necessary or appropriate so long as all of the fees and expenses of Stifel, Nicolaus & Company, Incorporated and Barnes & Thornburg LLP related to the issuance of the 2024 Refunding Bonds are paid from proceeds of the 2024 Refunding Bonds or money held by the Building Corporation.

The members of the Board, the Superintendent, the Chief Financial Section 4. Officer and any officers or employees of the School Corporation as any of the foregoing may direct are hereby authorized and directed, for and on behalf of the School Corporation, to execute, attest and seal all such documents, instruments, certificates, closing papers and other papers and do all such acts and things as may be necessary to carry out the intent of these resolutions, including, but not limited to, one or more Preliminary Official Statements and Final Official Statements, each substantially in the form and substance acceptable to the Superintendent or the Chief Financial Officer, one or more Bond Purchase Agreements, by and among the Building Corporation, the School Corporation and Stifel, Nicolaus & Company, Incorporated, as underwriter, and one or more Continuing Disclosure Contracts, prepared by bond counsel, executed by the School Corporation. Moreover, to the extent the President, based on the recommendation of the Superintendent or the Chief Financial Officer, determines to issue the 2024 Refunding Bonds with one or more series of new money first mortgage bonds issued at the same time by the Building Corporation, the 2024 Refunding Bonds may be combined with such issue or issues as a multipurpose bond issue and designated as such.
